

Most lives are lived parallel to the Kingdom, impacted by it, but never in touch with God's love.







PART TWO: EXPRESSION

CLARIFYING THE GOAL

Each member of Living Faith is invited to internalize and take ownership of both the response and the responsibility.

Our mission, vision, and strategy is summarized in our goal for every member of Living Faith — it is the birthright of every follower of Jesus to see someone saved in their living room AND to proclaim the gospel of Jesus in a foreign culture.



All our systems, training, discipleship, relationships, and engagement are designed to help people:

- Accomplish the goal.
- Repeat the goal.
- Help others accomplish and repeat the goal.

PART THREE: CORE VALUES

Core Values are the deeply rooted and emotionally connected filters that inform all of our interactions with God, ourself, our world and others. Core Values are often experienced through feeling and perception and can be difficult to define. People typically arrive at their core values through a lifetime of engagement with their family of origin, spiritual community, educational system, and key defining moments in life.

At Living Faith, our core values are expressed through our Four Pillars of Faith:



1. God is good.

It is our adamant belief that the fundamental nature of God's character is goodness. When Moses requested to see the glory of God, our Lord responded by saying, "I will cause all of goodness to pass in front of you and I will proclaim my name, the Lord, in your presence." (Exodus 33:18-19) The glory of God is His goodness!



2. We live from Heaven to Earth.

Paul teaches that "our citizenship is in heaven." (Philippians 3:20) We are ambassadors of the Kingdom of Heaven. Therefore, we live according to the government, culture, atmosphere, and economy of heaven. We live from heaven to earth, recognizing that what is invisible is a superior reality to what is visible. We will live according to the truth that Jesus taught us to pray, "Your Kingdom come, Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven." (Matthew 6:10)



3. Everyone is significant.

We see the fingerprints of God upon humanity. We will live lives of honor toward one another. We live to see people saved, healed, and delivered from the effects of sin, to help them identify their God-given personality, gifts, and purpose, and to see them actively invest themselves in the work of the Kingdom. Knowing everyone is significant leads me to understand that I am significant.



4. Nothing is impossible.

Really. The Bible says this. We believe it.

PART THREE: CORE VALUES

Our core values are also expressed through our Five Principles of Living:

1. Live in the *Spirit*

Life in the Spirit is characterized in two ways. We pursue a life that is Word based and Spirit empowered. We submit to the Bible as the authoritative revelation of God's design for humanity. The Holy Spirit is the presence of Jesus in the life of a believer. We will live in dynamic relationship with the Holy Spirit as the source, substance, and strength of our lives.

2. Live in *Shalom*

Shalom is one of the great blessings of living as a follower of God.

We will allow our lives to be sustained by the presence of God which guards our lives with peace.

Our prayer for you echoes the blessing given by the Apostle John in his 3rd letter, "Beloved, I pray that you may prosper in all things and be in good health, just as your soul prospers." (3 John 2 NKJV)

We pray that you would thrive from the inside out. As you become healthy on the inside, that your relationships would be healthy, that your body would be healthy, that your home and finances would be healthy, and that you would create lifegiving and healthy environments everywhere you go.

PART THREE: CORE VALUES

3. Live in *Community*

The Christian faith is communal. Our individual relationship with Jesus is deeply intimate and personal, but it finds its true expression in the relationship with others.

Our 20/20 Vision for community is described by Paul in Acts 20:20, “You know that I have not hesitated to preach anything that would be helpful to you but have taught you publicly and from house to house.”

We desire to create environments where the church can be strengthened both through the public meeting on Sunday morning and through Community Groups that meet house to house.

We describe this lifestyle as one of being spiritually rooted and community focused.

PART THREE: CORE VALUES

4. Live to *Give*

"For God so loved the world that He gave..." John 3:16

God expressed His love through generosity. At Living Faith, we express generosity through the stewardship of our time, talents, and treasures.

- **Time**: the asset we can only use once

Ephesians 5:15-16 (NASB)

"So then, be careful how you walk, not as unwise people but as wise, making the most of your time, because the days are evil."

- **Talent**: our natural and supernatural abilities given to us by God

I Peter 4:10 (NIV)

"Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms."

- **Treasure**: God owns it all and has instituted the tithe as a principle to get to our hearts

Proverbs 3:9-10 (NKJV)

"Honor the Lord with your possessions, and with the firstfruits of all your increase; so your barns will be filled with plenty, and your vats will overflow with new wine."

Malachi 3:10 (NIV)

"Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this," says the Lord Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it."

PART THREE: CORE VALUES

5. Live God *Loud*

Everything we do as a church family is filtered through this 5th principle. We live, work, worship, and love others with a joyful exuberance. We are thankful for what we have received and joyful in how we live.

Living God Loud is most clearly expressed through our:

- Passionate Worship

Psalms 100 (NIV)

"Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth. Worship the Lord with gladness; come before him with joyful songs. Know that the Lord is God. It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, the sheep of his pasture. Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name. For the Lord is good and his love endures forever; his faithfulness continues through all generations."

- Joyful Service

1 Peter 4:7-11 (MSG)

"Everything in the world is about to be wrapped up, so take nothing for granted. Stay wide-awake in prayer. Most of all, love each other as if your life depended on it. Love makes up for practically anything. Be quick to give a meal to the hungry, a bed to the homeless—cheerfully. Be generous with the different things God gave you, passing them around so all get in on it: if words, let it be God's words; if help, let it be God's hearty help. That way, God's bright presence will be evident in everything through Jesus, and he'll get all the credit as the One mighty in everything—encores to the end of time. Oh, yes!"

PLAN OF ACTION

Our plan for regularly connecting spiritual truth to the contextual needs of new and established members of Living Faith:



Sunday Morning

The weekend worship service is a sacred gathering of the Body of Christ designed to welcome people into the presence of God and provide a highly applicable encounter with God’s Word. In our current culture, we recognize that the Sunday morning service is our “front door” to our community. Therefore, in our gathering and ministry, we pay special attention to the needs of guests to be able to understand and connect with our worship expression.

Wednesday Evening

Our Wednesday evenings are designed to promote a family discipleship rhythm in which each member of the family is able to participate in a consistent and sustainable fashion.

First Wednesday Rotation: Night of Worship / Men's Night / Women's Night

Second Wednesday: Community Groups

Third Wednesday: PRAYGROUND Family Discipleship

Fourth Wednesday: Community Groups

Fifth Wednesday: Free

Every Wednesday: Youth Meeting for grades 6-12


Fellowship Meals

Gathering around a meal is a central component of biblical community. We seek to join together quarterly to participate in the sacred mystery of breaking bread with one another.

PART FOUR: DISCIPLESHIP PATH

Growth Track

Our Growth track is designed to connect people with the mission of Living Faith. It consists of three classes which will help them grow in their faith, understand the church, discover ways to serve, and develop new relationships.



Discovery 101:

Membership Class which introduces families to the essential beliefs of the church and our strategy for bringing faith to life.

Dream Team 201:

Volunteer training which introduces people to their personal gifts and motivations and provides opportunities to grow in relationship and discipleship through service in the Body of Christ.

Values 301: (coming soon!)

A five week small group which will help families grow in relational connection as they further examine the essential doctrines and values of Living Faith.

Mission Trips:

Living Faith works to offer missions opportunities for each member, in both local and global contexts.

PART FOUR: DISCIPLESHIP PATH

Team Nights

Provide an opportunity for continued training and appreciation of our Dream Team members in the context of fun and fellowship. Teams meet Sunday evenings on a rotating quarterly schedule.

Community Groups

Living Faith facilitates small groups through the “Free Market” approach. Members of Living Faith are invited to host groups, provided they adhere to the simple guidelines presented in our Community Group playbook. The essential guidelines listed in the playbook are: communication, accountability, semester scheduling, and child safety.

Discipleship Groups

Living Faith hosts a variety of discipleship groups to promote spiritual growth and development in a highly relational context.

Summer Discipleship Series

Regular church scheduling is interrupted in the summer months for a rewarding opportunity to engage 6-8 week classes. These rotating classes offer opportunities for theological training, biblical literacy, ministry development, and life-skills, such as finances, parenting, marriage enrichment, etc.

Nicene Creed

On the third day he rose again
in accordance with the Scriptures;

PART FIVE: DOCTRINE

DOCTRINAL STATEMENTS

The Godhead

God is one Spirit Who eternally manifests Himself as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The Father is the Source of all things; the Son is the Creator and Redeemer; the Holy Spirit is the agent of all life both in the creation of the world and in the regeneration of the sinner.

(Matt. 3:16 17; John 4:24; Eph. 4:4 6; 1 Cor. 15; Col. 1)

The Scriptures

The Scriptures in their entirety are the very words of God. They are Divine; they are infallible and inerrant in the original manuscripts.

(2 Tim. 3:16; 1 Thess. 2:13; 2 Peter 1:21)

Mankind's Fall and Redemption

Mankind is a created being, made in the image of God, but through Adam's transgression and fall, sin entered the world (Rom. 5:14; Rom. 3:10; Rom. 3:23; 1 John 3:8). Consequently, all people are sinners by nature and by choice and are guilty before God (Eph. 2:3; Rom. 5:12; Is. 53:6; John 3:36; Rom 3:10, 23; Gal. 3:10). Jesus was sent to redeem humanity from God's punishment for sin, from the power of sin and from the curse of the law. In redemption, through Jesus' death on the cross, people are restored to right relationship with God. Those who are "in Christ" are born of God (John 1:13), are called "sons of God" (1 John 3:1), receive eternal life (John 3:16), and are joint heirs with Christ (Rom 8:17; Gal. 4:7). They are washed, sanctified and justified (1 Cor. 6:11). They have peace with God (Rom. 5:1) and are reconciled to God (Rom. 5:10). They are the temples of the Holy Spirit (1 Cor. 6:19; Acts 2). They receive forgiveness of sins (Col. 1:14), are dead to sin (Rom. 6:11), and are redeemed from the presence and power of iniquity (Tit. 2:14).

PART FIVE: DOCTRINE

Eternal Separation from God

Those who reject Christ are already dead spiritually, and have only to look forward to physical death and eternal separation from God. (Matt. 3:12; 25:30, 41, 46; 2 Thess. 1:9; Heb. 9:27; Rev. 19:20)

Repentance

Repentance is a gift from God. Repentance is dependent upon the convicting work of the Holy Spirit in the lives of people. The conviction of the Holy Spirit, which often accompanies the preaching of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, will result in the revelation of the sinfulness of self which should lead to godly sorrow. Repentance is a total change of heart, mind, attitude, emotions, will, action and lifestyle flowing from the Holy Spirit's conviction of sin. (2 Cor. 7:10; Psalm 51; Acts 11:18; 2 Tim. 2:25; Gen. 6:3; Rom. 1:18 32; Matt. 9:12 13)

Sanctification and Christian Maturity

The Christian has been set apart to God, and by His grace should live in a manner that is distinctly different from the world. The believer is set free from sin (Rom 6:18), is a new creation (2 Cor. 5:17), and is dead to sin (Rom. 6:2; 1 Pet. 2:24). Sanctified is what the believer is; mature is what he or she is to become (Eph. 4:13).

PART FIVE: DOCTRINE

The Church

The church is a living organism with each of its members in vital relationship to the others, all partaking of a common life (1 Cor. 12). Within the universal church, each local body has Christ as its head and consists of born again believers, gathered together by the Holy Spirit for the purpose of fellowship, worship, observance of the ordinances, propagation of the gospel, and the teaching of the Word of God, all in accordance with biblical revelation.

Ordinances

Jesus left his followers specific instructions on how key aspect of Christian worship and community should be practiced. These practices have been called ordinances throughout church history. We believe in these New Testament ordinances: water baptism by immersion, the communion of the bread and cup, and the “love feast.”

(Matt. 28:19; 1 Cor. 11:20-34).

Baptism of the Holy Spirit

The baptism in the Holy Spirit is a gift from God as promised by the Lord Jesus Christ to all believers and is received subsequent to the new birth.

(Matt. 3:11; John 14:16, 17; Acts 1:8; Acts 2:38, 39; Acts 19:17; Acts 2:4)

The Return of the Lord

The Lord Jesus Christ will literally, personally, visibly and bodily return to the earth. No one knows the time of His return.

(Matt. 24:36)

PART FIVE: DOCTRINE

DOCTRINAL DISTINCTIVES

We recognize that as a church we are simply a small part of the global and timeless Body of Christ. We recognize and honor our heritage in the history of the church and connection to current expressions of the church both locally and around the world.

While devotion to Christ is the common bond that connects us to the universal church, a few key distinctives help to define our interpretation and application of Scripture.

Spirit-Empowered

We believe the Baptism of the Holy Spirit is available to all believers and the gifts of the Holy Spirit as witnessed in the book of Acts and referenced throughout the New Testament are still in operation in the church today. “Charismatic” is an interchangeable term that could be used to describe our theology and practice of relating to the Holy Spirit and His active involvement in the church.

Egalitarian

We affirm the full equality of women and men as taught and modeled in the Bible. We believe that every person, regardless of race, sex, or status, is qualified to engage their God-given gifts and callings in ministry to the church and world.

PART FIVE: DOCTRINE

Non-denominational

“Denomination” is the term use to describe an organization of churches that share a common history, doctrine, government structure, or worship style. Though members of our church come from a wide variety of denominational backgrounds, Living Faith is not affiliated with a denomination.

We maintain relationship with a group of churches through a system that is relational, but not denominational. These relationships provide ministry support to our leaders and organizational resources for our church to equip us to be healthy and high impact in our community.

Missional

A missional perspective in one which maintains a posture of allowing the realities of the Kingdom of God to invade every area of life. To live missionally is to embody the purposes of Christ within one’s own life. Missional living recognizes that church is not a place I go, but the interconnected life that I live. We like to imagine that missional living is another way of describing normal Christianity.

Contextual Hermeneutics


We honor the Bible as God’s word and submit to it as the revelation of His will for humanity. Our honor of Scripture leads us to careful consideration of its interpretation and application in the life of a believer.

The guiding principle of our biblical interpretation is that “the Bible means what it meant.” In order to accurately understand God’s word we must first seek to discern how it would have been heard and applied by its original audience. From the place of understanding the Bible’s original context and content we seek to build a bridge of practical application of the content to our context. It is our sincere desire to continually perform this task in a way that honors God and maintains the integrity of His will as revealed in His word.

PART SIX: STRUCTURE

CHURCH GOVERNMENT

Believers who invest their hearts, time, families, and finances in the building of the local church deserve to have confidence in church leadership. People are looking for leaders who conduct themselves with integrity and respect when making decisions that affect their lives.



Living Faith is guided by staff, guarded by elders, and gifted by membership. Because of this balance, the believers who call Living Faith their home church are free to grow in faith and in relationships within the body.

The Role of the Elders

The elders are God-ordained leaders who serve the body by providing spiritual oversight, counsel, and leadership. They are selected from among the members of our church. Living Faith has both male and female elders, and the Lead Pastor is also an Elder.

The Role of the Ministry Board

The Ministry Board is made up of the Elder board, the staff team and their spouses, and a few other rotating church members. This team serves to further communication between church members and the elder team, dream together about future goals, and problem solve existing challenges as we continue to grow and adapt to current needs.

Financial Accountability

Church leadership believes that financial integrity as an organization is of extreme importance. Therefore, the Elder Board and Lead Pastor hold Living Faith financially accountable. Living Faith publishes an annual review of finances in a printed publication, sharing that review at least once a year with the congregation.

PART SIX: STRUCTURE

CHURCH STAFF

Our staff team carries out the vision of Living Faith by overseeing the day-to-day ministry and operations of the church.

As a mixture of full time and part time employees, they are in the office Monday through Thursday, 9 am to 5 pm.

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
