#### **Defenders of the Faith**

#### "It's All In A [Biblical] Name"

There are approximately 3,000 people named in the Bible. Many of those share the same name and/or have more than one name. Christian converts Apollos (Acts 18:24) and Artemas (Titus 3:12) bore names of Greek gods. Only one woman served as sole ruler of Israel or Judah (Queen Athaliah). About 1,000 names appear for the first time in 1 Chronicles. Isaiah's son Maher-shalal-hash-baz (Isaiah 8:1) has the Bible's longest name, and it's a 5way tie for the shortest names: Uz (Genesis 10:23), Er (Genesis 38:7), Og (Numbers 21:33), Ir (1 Chronicles 7:12), and So (2 Kings 17:4). In addition to Methuselah, six people lived more than 900 years. Noah is also a woman's name, given to one of Zelophehad's five daughters (Numbers 26:33). The most common name in the Bible is Zechariah; there are 32 in the Old Testament, but only one in the New Testament (John the Baptist's father).

There are several personal names in the Bible that are familiar to many, but others that may not be as recognizable. Below are names of people included in the Bible. Some are more familiar than others. They are not in chronological order and two are not at all in scripture. Your mission if you accept it, is to place all personal names in proper time-order, what book the name first appears, and what two people are 'fictional." Also, one name is real, but the historical date is debated (hint: Job). Get your study cap and Bible. Godspeed in your efforts. Have fun! Ready, and go......

#### From Missions

The 2 local mission projects that Grace is involved with are Ruth's Harvest and PAL (Provide a Lunch). Both are through the Council of Churches.

Ruth's Harvest is also known as the "back pack" program. We pack bags with entrees, snacks, vegetables, drinks and breakfast items for children to take home for the weekend. The schools that we serve are Clearwater Elementary, Hanover Street Elementary, Washington Elementary and St. Josephs. The day of packing or the next day, the bags are delivered to those schools. At this time we are serving approximately 16 children.

The day Grace is scheduled, we need about 6 volunteers. It only takes about 1 1/2 hours. If you are interested in helping, please call Mae Woodard, 717-632-0124. Upcoming dates are: March 17, April 28 and May 24.

PAL

PAL is served at the Council of Churches on Carlisle Street. We prepare, serve a meal and clean up. At this time all meals are carry out. The time is 8:30 - approximately 12:30-12:45. All ingredients are there to be used. We are serving approximately 130 people, including meals on wheels, Monday thru Friday and 100 on the weekends.
