Defenders of the Faith

"The Case For Biblical Prayer
(Part 1 of 3)"

Prayer can mean many things to different people. Defined in a general and basic way, prayer is communication with God, a god, or another object of worship. Many religions recognize the need for prayer. But how is prayer defined to the follower of Jesus Christ? How is historical Biblical prayer set apart from other religious prayer?

What is prayer as it relates to the way things really are? What is prayer as it relates to reality? Prayer is relational, intentional, and direct access communication with God anytime and anywhere, accomplished by the finished work of our Savior and Lord Jesus Christ, in His death & bodily resurrection.

There are 650 prayers listed in the Bible. But why should we pray? Why is Biblical prayer important? What is the case for Biblical prayer? What is the apologetics of prayer?.....

There are two main sticking point questions regarding Biblical prayer that all followers of Jesus Christ should be ready to give an answer with clarity and charity. One: "Why doesn't God answer my prayers? Why does He seem silent?" and Two: "If God is in complete control and already knows what I need, then why pray? Why pray if God is sovereign?" We need to be able to address both questions with compassion and truth. Let's unpack them one at a time.

One of the arguments "against" prayer is that if there is a God, why doesn't He consistently answer the prayers of His followers? There are many devoted Christians who have earnestly prayed to God and seem to have their prayers go unanswered. Why does God seem to not answer all our prayers? Does unanswered prayer serve as evidence that the God of the Bible doesn't exist? How would you answer this objection? In order to do so, we must understand something about God's priorities. Our ideas about prayer and God's idea regarding prayer can sometimes be very different. In the model prayer Jesus gave in Luke 11:2-4, He teaches us how to pray by starting with praising God and acknowledging His holiness. Jesus states for His will to be accomplished before asking for anything for Himself. We need to have a 'God-first' approach in prayer.

It's true that many prayers seem to go unanswered, this perception is likely based on the idea that the only answer we would find acceptable to prayer is "Yes." That is not how it works with God. God listens to and answers all our prayers. No prayers go unanswered. Sometimes the answer is 'yes, I'll do it,' but sometimes the answer is 'no! There's a reason why this is not best for you' or simply 'not yet,' 'wait,' or 'not that way. Now is not the right time. Be patient and keep praying and wait to see what I'm going to do in your life and in others.'

In order to understand why a particular prayer might fall into one of these categories, it might be helpful to look at those prayers that God answers affirmatively. God says 'yes' to our genuine request for wisdom (James 1:5), forgiveness (1 John 1:9) and

salvation (Romans 10:13). Why would God say 'yes' to these prayers? God is more concerned with your eternal character than your temporary comfort. This is a major key to understand why God answers prayer the way He does. God responds to those prayers that help us to understand His priorities. God wants us to develop godly character, to fear the Lord (which is taking God seriously and faithfully), and to realize we are eternal beings.


Some prayers do get answered in the negative. It's not because he doesn't love you or isn't listening. He sees the whole picture, the end from the beginning (Isaiah 46:10). God says 'no' to prayers that violate His nature as the perfect source of truth and righteousness.

What about the truly righteous prayers that God doesn't seem to answer? These prayers are 'not yet' prayers. God, according to His perfect will, will say 'yes' to these requests but He may not respond in our desired timing or in our desired way. These prayers might be answered in this life or not until the next life. Our impatience is a result of our mortal focus on the 'now.' We seldom think about how short this life will be especially compared to eternity with God. It might seem that God is never going to answer 'yes,' but compared with eternity, this life is just a blink of an eye. These prayers are 'not yet' prayers because God fully intends to answer them in eternity. In the meantime, God is answering prayers with specific goals in mind. Does this help you understand who God is, does it help you develop the kind of patience, love, or character that He wants demonstrated here and now? Does it help you live for eternity rather than the fleeting moments of this earthly life? All is for His eternal glory!

God's methods and priorities are not like ours. We want things now, and God is concerned about our character in eternity. He has complete and perfect understanding of what is good for us, even if it makes little to no sense to us in the present. His ways are not our ways (Isaiah 55:8-9). We can expect and trust God to answer us, trusting Him even when the answer isn't what we were hoping for (Proverbs 3:5-6), knowing that He does hear and answer prayer. Our Heavenly Father will be faithful to answer our prayers when we call on Him.
