The Kids Clothes Closet is open every first Sunday of the month between our 9AM and 11AM services. The clothing closet is in need of help sorting items, then folding/hanging/stocking clothes for the current season.

Food Bank Open Every Monday @ 5PM

Did you know our food bank here gives away a lot of food? We give out around 200 bags of food each month. If you would like some help feeding your family, or know of anyone who would like help, we give to anyone who asks!

Where does the food come from?

The food we give away comes from several sources: we buy food by the pound from the Butte County Food Bank in Oroville, and we receive bread, and some fresh produce, from the Chico Gleaners. After that, whatever we still need we get from Winco. Additionally, food comes from folks who like to give from a specific list, since we have carefully designed the bags to hold specific meals.




Sanctuary Volume

through Community Groups that meet


throughout the week. We also


