Safeguarding: a quick reference guide

If you have a concern about possible abuse:

- 1. In an emergency, call emergency services on 999.
- 2. Consult the person to whom you are responsible.
- Decide together whether to seek advice or to make an immediate referral to police or Social Care services.
- **4.** Always contact the Safeguarding leader or Deputy Safeguarding leader.
- Keep a record of what happened, your concerns and your actions.
- 6. Only tell others who need to know.

If a child, young person, parent or other adult shares with you about abuse:

- 1. Never promise to keep a secret.
- 2. React calmly: be aware of your non-verbal messages.
- Listen. Keep listening. Do not ask leading questions or investigate.
- 4. Avoid making comments or judgements.
- 5. Tell them what you are going to do and that they will be told what happens.
- Record using the person's own words, noting dates, times, location, events and any other people present.

- Contact the Safeguarding leader or Deputy Safeguarding leader and the person to whom you are responsible.
- 8. Only tell those who need to know.

Remember:

- Treat everyone with respect, setting a positive example for others.
- 2. Respect personal space and privacy.
- 3. Ensure any actions cannot be misrepresented.
- **4.** Challenge unacceptable behaviour in a constructive way.
- Do not put yourself or others in vulnerable situations.
- Keep physical, verbal or digital contact with others appropriate.
- 7. Always share safeguarding concerns.
