These questions are designed to help you talk about God's word and Pastor Brian's message with friends and family. You of course can use your own questions, but we'd like to give you this tool to encourage Biblical fellowship and discipleship in your circle of relationships. *Enjoy discovering more about Him!*

"SHARED MINISTRY" | EXODUS 18 | PASTOR BRIAN

WARM-UP QUESTION:

What is the best food to offer someone before you have to share some serious advice?

"Sharing the Story" - (Exodus 18: 1-8)

Jethro had watched his son-in-law leave to face Pharaoh and free his people, an impossible task, and Moses shares how God brings him victory and Jethro is impressed. What do people learn about God when He completes what He starts?

"Sharing the Praise" - (Exodus 18: 9-12)

Jethro offers sacrifices to God and Moses, Aaron and the elders all share this special meal. What is important about celebrating what God has done with others? What are things that get in the way of this?

"Sharing the Service" - (Exodus 18: 13-27)

We see Jethro identify that if Moses leads by himself, he won't endure and the people will wear out. What causes leaders like Moses to not share their responsibilities? What are ways this wears people out?

REFLECTION QUESTION:

In this passage Jethro believed that there were people who were able and God-fearing with character who could share the burden of leading the Israelites. He believed "God will direct" through sharing the burden, in other words, it's an act of faith. Sharing with others takes work and risk, but from the beginning God has said "it is not good for man to be alone". Are you sharing your burdens with others? Have you asked God to reveal trustworthy people you can share with?

Exodus 18 8-1-21

Shared Ministry

I. Slide1 Announce:

- A. Slide2-5 Larry: Hope Min. Men's. Ladies. Ministry Fair.
- B. Ministry Fair watch and see how that ties in to Exodus 18 this morning.
- C. Prayer: May we <u>live</u> the <u>Great Commandment</u> (love God/man) & <u>fulfill</u> the <u>Great Commission</u>.
 - 1. Goodrich's who lost their 18yr old daughter, shot/killed in Corona Theater. Nikki Villegas

II. Slide6 Intro: Shared Ministry

- A. This week our narrative transitions *away from* the wilderness difficulties and the anticipation of <u>receiving the law at Sinai</u>.
 - 1. We run into once again Jethro, Moses his father-in-law, who will educate us on the importance of leadership, working smarter not harder, sharing the load, and the importance of Shared Ministry.
 - 2. We met Jethro/Reuel in ch.2. When Moses was 40 killed the Egyptian, so he fled to Midian. Saves Reuel's 7 daughters watering camels. Reuel gives him his daughter Zipporah, have baby 1, then 2. On way back to Egypt sends Zipper & boys back to dad (never says why, but here they're reunited)

III. SHARED MINISTRY (read all)

- A. Moses 2 boys told the story of his life: Gershom (stranger there) Eliezer (God's my help).
 - 1. I was a stranger there, but God is my helper!
- B. Slide7 Jethro not Jethro *on Beverly Hillbillies*, nor Jethro Gibbs *on NCIS*, nor the Jethro Tull band, but *the priest Midian*.
- C. Slide8a Moses is taking advice from his father-in-law. He is a Midianite priest. He was outside the faith, a priest of another religion. Or is he still?
- D. We see the gospel witness from Moses (8). [though Gospel is a NT word, means good news]
 - 1. He probably shared: about the burning bush, plagues of rivers to blood, insects, amphibians, disease storms of hail, darkness, death of 1st born,

- redemption, Israel saved by the blood of the Lamb, Red Sea crossing, bread from heaven, water from rock, defeat of the Amalekites.
- E. And Jethro's response seems to be, *Now I get it* (9).
 - 1. Slide8b The only thing missing here in their *family reunion* is the chicken and potato salad. This is possibly Jethro's conversion? (*re-read* 10,11)
 - a) Earlier he was skeptical, but now he sees *a super-power defeated*, and that this God of Israel is an <u>active</u> God, who dealt with Egypt's pride.
 - 2. It seems Jethro believes in Yahweh: as we see he offers sacrifices and a shares in a covenant meal (12).
 - 3. But I need to add, *not all commentators believe this.* Elsewhere in the OT, other non-Israelites invoke the name of Yahweh with no particular faith in Him. (Gen 26:28–29; Josh 2:9–11; 1 Kgs 5:7; 2 Chr 2:11; Jonah 1:16)
- F. Slide9a Moses is helping w/all disputes. 600,000 men (+ wife and children).
 - 1. This is hard enough in just your own family!
 - 2. They have no government system set up yet. There is no *trias politica* (separation of powers). Moses is the *legislative*, *executive*, & *judicial* branch.
 - 3. Moses isn't trying to be a one man show. He's just trying to be *faithful to his calling*. But to use our gifts wisely, we need to *know our limitations*.
- G. Slide9b (21) 4 Qualities: Able men capable. Fear God realizing what you do is for God. Trustworthy men of truth, not for money, not to be seen. Hate a bribe covetousness.
- H. Slide9c (21) 1000, 100, 50, 10 Some men are capable of certain amounts.
 - Here a judiciary system is set up. An army general would recognize it as the old military strategy of divide and conquer. And economist would call it the division of labor. The Bible calls it Presbyterianism/presbyters/ elders (NT).
 - a) It was a plan for *providing pastoral* care for the people of God.

- Today, we see Jesus as our Moses, Mediator, High Priest, King, Savior, Head of the Church. Who calls pastors/elders as overseers (to provide biblical instruction & spiritual care). Then many gifted men and women who oversee our ministries. Then our small group leaders and facilitators.
- I. (22b) They will bear the burden **with you** Moses you're not giving up your responsibilities like *praying*, *teaching*, & *handling the bigger matters*. But others will help you thus, *bearing one another's burdens*.
- J. Slide9d (23) God will direct you it's not a magic *formula*, it's simply what Paul says later, *Let all things be done decently and in order*. 1 Cor.14:40
- K.(23) you will be **able to endure** so you don't tank, wipe out, or burn out.
 - 1. Slide9e Neil Young famously sang in *Out of the Blue* (my my, hey hey), "It's better to burn out than it is to rust." It is often said that we should, "come apart before we come apart."
- L. (23b) peace/shalom this will bring blessing among all the people.

M.Slide10a What we see here is *shared ministry*.

- 1. Even in the Church today, 1 person can't do it all. And the reminder to all of us, work smarter not harder.
- 2. **Shared ministry** is for the blessing and benefit of everybody.
- 3. The NT teaches us, a healthy community practices **shared ministry** by a **plurality of qualified elders** who oversee the ministry the church.
 - a) Slide10b Eph.4:11,12 nlt Now these are the gifts Christ gave to the church: the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, and the pastors and teachers. 12 Their responsibility is to equip God's people to do his work and build up the church, the body of Christ.
- N. As Moses looked for character qualities, so the NT places the emphasis on the character of the elders.
- O. Slide 11 Senior pastor? Really Jesus carries that title, *Chief Shepherd*.

- 1. 1 Pet.5 NLT 2 shepherd the flock of God that is among you, exercising oversight, not under compulsion, but willingly, as God would have you; not for shameful gain, but eagerly; 3 not domineering over those in your charge, but being examples to the flock. 4 And when the chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the unfading crown of glory.
- 2. The pastors and elders are *under-shepherds* of the Chief Shepherd. I really am 1 of the pastors of CM. I'm the main teaching pastor. As different pastors/elders we are gifted in different ways, helping to oversee the running of the church.
- P. Our other pastors/leaders aren't *the B-Team*! Whether they are showing up to do a hospital visit or teaching on Wednesday nights. Shame on you if you see it that way.
 - 1. In this last Wed Night series AL, AP, Jason, & Cam did so great.
 - 2. You might think you're <u>complementing me</u> saying, <u>we only like/come</u> when <u>you</u> teach. I see that as a <u>complete failure</u> on <u>my</u> part, or <u>maybe it's</u> an <u>immaturity on yours</u>?
 - 3. Yes practically I have taught over 5,000 bible studies, over 3 decades. So yes hopefully *I've learned something* or have *pulpit experience*. But don't we believe that it's the Holy Spirit teaching us, through the mouthpiece that God has set before us?
- Q. Structurally/governmentally CM is set up as **The** *orig* **Moses Model**, which I inherited from day-1 (1 guy in charge). But from the beginning I purposed to <u>not</u> **lead** that way. Instead I've tried to practically live out the NT's **Plurality Model**. [Governing board vs. advisory board. *more of a collaboration, us seeking God together*].
 - 1. Having a Plurality of <u>leaders</u> praying & strategizing, builds in a good effective *accountability* where nothing is done in isolation.
 - 2. It builds in a good *decision making* through prayer & continuity.
 - 3. Which builds in a more *permanent and longevity* in CM as an organization.
 - 4. It also helps to <u>avoid</u> a *Rockstar mentality* (1 guy at the top we see in a # of churches). Because when the rockstar leaves, the church usually

R. Slide12 *The Trellis and The Vine* (is a book by, *Colin Marshall and Tony Payne*)

- 1. There <u>has</u> to be a trellis type structure to support the vine. You can't get away from this. The trellis represents *the organizational structures and programs* that exist at our church, to support the vine work and its *growth*.
- 2. But how silly to make it all about *the trellis* that will <u>soon be covered</u>, or to go overboard and make it out of <u>4x4 posts</u>? So you want just enough trellis to support the vine, because it's all about *vine work*.
- 3. *If* the total effort of the church is the trellis, then the vine will never get planted, and thus can't *grow*.
- 4. Myself & our leadership team will take care of the trellis, so we ALL can put our efforts into the vine. Here in the OT. Also in the NT. Share in Ministry here at CM.
- S. Communion: as they came out and <u>joined</u> him (Jethro) in a sacrificial meal **in** *God's presence* (12), we come to gather to do the same.
 - 1. Thank you for coming out and joining us at CM this morning, in a sacrificial meal ... in God's presence.
- T. Conclusion: in order to have a healthy community here at CM ...
 - 1. Let's fight like Joshua and pray like Moses.
 - 2. Let's be good gospel witnesses, to our neighbors & our family members.
 - 3. Let's practice a **Shared Ministry**. Gal.6:2 **Share each other's burdens**, and in this way obey the law of Christ.
 - 4. Let's not worry about a title or a position, but about all of us finding our ministry.
 - 5. Let's build up the body of Christ by serving, loving, & praying.
