Each home still has work to be done. As we move forward with contracted rough ins, we need financial support. We are having to hire licensed contractors to work with inspectors for electrical and plumbing.



Participation -



The finish line is in sight for the first residence being welcomed to The Light Community! If you have been following our journey, obstacles have been numerous over the past four and half years. Yet, the testimony of the progress reflects the provision of our God. He placed a vision for Crossroads Community to impact the lives of individuals and families that need to find Him and gain traction in life. God directed us to the farm to begin building this vision. Through the years, we have welcomed mission teams and volunteers from over fourteen states that have donated time and resources. We are so blessed!

Now, we stand with the finish line in view to welcome the first residents. Now is the time we are seeking prayer, partnership, and participation to cross the finish line. Our goal is to open four homes and the laundry house by May 1st. As these homes are being filled, we will move forward with summer 2022 teams to finish more homes. Our goal is to welcome a few families and individuals at time to make the adjustments we need for ministry on an entirely different level.







A Spiritual Reproductive Ministry

The Light Community currently has nine homes ready for contracted work (electrical and plumbing). Waste water systems are continuing to be installed. The utility companies are moving forward with the needed logistics to provide water and electricity to each home. In addition to the homes on site, the tenth house has been started in Georgia and will be delivered and put in place the last week of March. We will continue to move forward to build the last resident, a duplex for missions and retreat, and the office building. We will also continue to move forward with community components such as flooring in the prayer chapel, a barn, additional greenhouses, trails, and picnic gathering areas. As you can see, this will be a work in progress as we welcome our first residents.



Crossroads Community Baptist has had an interesting journey through the past couple years as many other churches. Thankfully, we are seeing some turning tides! Over the past several months, we have welcomed in visitors that ware connecting in for worship, Bible studies, and service. We are excited to see all that God has in store as many mission teams partner with us in the coming months.

The Lord's Café is going great. Stephanie is doing a great job running the day in and out operation at The Lord's Café. This year, we are open three days a week for lunch instead of two. Our numbers has been a rollercoaster. Between weather and health concerns, we are thankful to be moving out of winter.

Thursdays have changed for this season without mission teams. When teams are not available, we have downsized the grocery giveaway. We introduced Pantry Days on Thursdays to meet the most immediate needs for food.

As we look forward to mission teams coming in the next few weeks,

we are excited to offer more ministry opportunities for our community. Throughout the next several months, our community will continue to hear the gospel and witnesses the compassion of Christ lived out.
