#### FROM YOUR MINISTER JIMMY READER

At 72 years of age, I know that life is full of mixed blessings. Good things all coming at the same time, but with mixed feelings about some of them. That's where we are in early spring of 2021.

We have been in lockdown or living with significant restrictions for a full year now. After a second Covid wave in the past few months, the "numbers" are down



again to a level where we are able to begin Sunday services in the sanctuary on Easter Sunday. What better day to do this than Resurrection Day! Kathy Borden's trio, LumenEssence, will again be with us that day in the sanctuary to offer their gifts of music for our service.

We recognize, though, that not everyone has been vaccinated yet, and some are not comfortable with returning until later on. We have been preparing for that and are now able to Livestream our services from the sanctuary. We are just now setting it up and will be training our team. We will let you know all the details as soon as possible, but you will be able to worship with us in "real time" by watching on our website, the church app on your phone, YouTube, or Facebook. Some of you have TVs which allow you to get on the internet, and you would be able to find it easily that way. If not, you will still need to use your computer. We will provide more information week by week.

The ability to livestream our services means that anyone anywhere can participate in this way – either live at the time of the service or through the recorded video (which will automatically load on our website and YouTube when the service is ended). ... Many people have enjoyed the interaction we've had on Zoom, and we recognize that will be lost with Livestream and recorded videos. Until we are able to have in-person coffee hour again, we will continue to give you opportunity after the service to join in a "coffee hour" on Zoom so you can catch up with one another.

Another area of mixed blessings is my retirement. I will celebrate 51 years of active, ordained ministry on May 3 this year, and May 16 will be my final Sunday with you as your minister. Who knew in July 2013 (nearly 8 years ago) – when the Council hired me as a short-term interim minister - that I would stay this long?

It has been good. ... It is a mixed blessing for you because you will go on to find another minister to serve you and to share her or his life with you. That person will bring different experiences, personality, strengths, and gifts as you move into the next phase of this church's history.

Still another area of mixed blessing is technology. We have been on a 5-year path toward creating a multimedia system to enhance our worship and learning throughout the building. We put in a state-of-the-art sound system and hearing loop. We installed a large screen in Howard Hall and bought other screens for the lounge and the youth room upstairs. ... Then the pandemic hit us, and we were forced to find ways to worship, meet, and fellowship together when we could not do it in person. Richard Ashworth graciously spent hours every week to record our service on video, edit it, and put it online for people to view. For awhile, we were back together on Sundays at the church, and Richard continued to record the services live, edit them, and post them online.

Then, of course, a second wave of Covid hit us, and we had to stop meeting together in person again. This time we chose to use Zoom for our services. That worked better, I think, than most of us thought it might. We were able to see and hear one another, at least, and be interactive before and after the service and share our joys and concerns. ... During this year, we worked with a company called Subsplash to provide our congregation with a phone app for communication about church activities by picking up our phones. That's integrated with our new church website so that when we post a new video or create other church communications, we do it just once for both the app and website. Now, through Subsplash, we will begin livestreaming our services. If people cannot come to on the sanctuary on any given Sunday for whatever reason, they can still turn on their TV or open their computer and worship with us. And the recordings will be available on our website and YouTube soon after the service ends.


It's a new day, as we say, with what many call "digital ministry." Our whole world is "digital" – with information, concerts, music, movies, and just about anything else available at all hours. With the final phase of our multimedia project complete –with full capability for integrated sound, video, graphics, videos, and more as part of worship, learning, and community events – we will have entered this "digital age" at UCP.

This will be my last Easter with you. We are not planning a Maundy Thursday service, but it will be good to be in the sanctuary on that day, even if many of you are not there. And my last seven Sundays will be in the sanctuary, gathered with as many of you as possible from Sunday to Sunday. The only thing "mixed" about that is that not all of you will be able to come yet, and we still cannot do much handshaking and hugging. Maybe on May 16? You are a good and generous church, and we will miss you, but it is time for me to retire.




