



WPC WELCOMES GUEST PREACHER THE REV. DR. M. CRAIG BARNES PRESIDENT, PRINCETON THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY JUNE 26



Join us as a beloved pastor, professor, and seminary president leads us in worship, Bible study and conversation. Dr. M. Craig Barnes has served since 2013 as the seventh president of Princeton Theological Seminary. Before taking the position, Barnes was a chaired professor at Pittsburgh Theological Seminary while also serving as the pastor and head of staff of Shadyside Presbyterian Church.

The author of nine books, Barnes focuses on his deep commitment to the theological formation of pastors to lead the church in changing times. Barnes earned his Master of Divinity degree from Princeton Seminary in 1981 and his Ph.D. in church history from the University of Chicago in 1992.

His sermon is entitled: ***"What if You Aren't Lost? Most of the church's presentation of the Gospel is focused on saving the lost. But what does the Gospel also say for the careful elder brothers who never fled their responsibilities?"***

Dr. Barnes will also teach our Adult Education class at 9am in the Chapel and via Zoom. The title of the program is: **"What Is a Church Home Today?"** We used to expect the church to be a relatively stable institution that contributed to our understanding of home along with family, education, and clear vocational paths. This collective sense of home is what centered us in a volatile and changing world, providing identity and mission. But the forces of change are now disrupting this notion of home as well. So how does the church adjust to its new role in forming identity and mission as Christians?

There will also be a special coffee hour for fellowship and Q&A with Dr. Barnes after the 10am worship service.
