Symphony No. 1, Finale L. Vierne

Louis Vierne suffered a number of tragedies in his life, including the loss of family in WWI, blindness, and a car accident later in life. His music often expands on the western tradition of harmony and uses harmonic and rhythmic ideas from other cultures. The Finale from Symphony No. 1 is very traditional though and is one of Vierne's most popular pieces.

It is often played at weddings as it was during the marriage celebration of Alan and Susan Hickok. Today it is played in Susan's memory.
