- We pay for a yearly external audit of all of our financials.
- We take 17% of our weekly offerings as tithe and give this to missionaries and ministry organizations.

Four questions to ask yourself:
1. What relationship needs to be? God wants us to do life together. We al need others for support, encouragement, and accountability. You have to look for these relationships. Don't wait for them to come to you!
2. What relationship needs to be? Is there a priority relationship in your life that is not where it is supposed to be?
3. What relationship needs to be? Is there a relationship that is damaged and not where it should be? Pain of an unresolved conflict is greater than the pain of confrontation.
4. What relationship needs to be? There may be times when you have to distance yourself from bad company. "Bad company corrupts good character." 1 Corinthians 15:33

Two things to ask yourself:

3. Saving (savings, investments, etc.)
2. What is my plan? When you fail to plan, you plan to fail! With a financial
plan, your finances can end up somewhere on purpose! A simple time-tested approach to finances would be to use Dave Ramsey' baby steps:  1. Emergency fund of \$1000
2. Debt Snowball - pay off debts smallest to largest.

- 3. Emergency fund of 3-6 months of expenses

- 4. Save for kids college
- 5. Save 15% of your income for retirement
- 6. Pay off your home
- 7. Give and Save

### The four dimensions of Purpose

Our purpose is made up of past experiences, core values, personality, and motivational gifts.

### 1. Your Past Experiences

### 2. Your Core Values

"Where there is no vision, the people perish." Proverbs 29:18 (KJV). When God made you, He planted within you certain things that you value deeply. They're hardwired into your heart. Through your life experiences, God has begun to make them clear to you. These are the things that you would be willing to die for. They explain how you come by your personal priorities. These things are your core values. It is important for all of us to clarify our values.
