WHAT'S THE BIG DEAL ABOUT WORSHIP? (Thoughts from our current message series)



As Christians, we know that we should WORSHIP the Lord. We read that SO many times throughout the Bible! (Psalms 95, 100, 145-150 ... for starters!)

Yet, many Christians don't know how to worship God in a real, authentic, from the heart manner. Worshipping God is not just singing – although

we CAN worship Him when we sing! It is not just attending

church – though we CAN worship Him when we attend church. It is not just in giving to the Lord, though giving CAN be an act of worship.

This is also why Jesus implemented what we call "Communion" – to help us remember.

Church, WE are blessed. YOU are blessed. We have much for which to be thankful all year long. But since this is Thanksgiving Week, I am URGING all members to spend some time this week, in PRAYER, in PRAISE, and in THANKSGIVING to God for WHO He is, WHAT He has done (don't forget He sent His ONLY Son – John 3:16), and, in particular, WHAT He has done for YOU personally.
