Confession and Assurance

Let us confess our sins to God.

We have not loved you with our whole heart;
we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves.
We are truly sorry and we humbly repent.
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,
have mercy on us and forgive us;
that we may delight in your will,
and walk in your ways,
to the glory of your Name.

As you have promised us in your Word so we believe, and find assurance: If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. *[1 John 1:9]*

Let us pray as our Savior has taught us.

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil.
For yours is the kingdom, and the power and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.

Communion

What I received from the Lord is what I deliver to, that the Lord Jesus Christ, on the very night when he was betrayed, took the bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take and eat. This is my body, broken for you. Do this in remembrance of me." And in the same way after supper, he took the cup, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to the disciples, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For whenever you eat this bread, and whenever you drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes again. These are the gifts of God for the people of God. Taste and see the goodness of the Lord in the gift of his Son.

[Those who are baptized may share in the bread and the cup.]
