12-19-21 Sermon Notes "When Joy Is Our Song"

What is it about music that brings us such joy? Did you feel that this past Sunday when we had our Christmas Cantata presented by our Cancel Choir and Orchestra? I sure did! What about Sunday night, when the children sang? Angelic! How could you hear those kids sing *Joy to the World* and not smile?

One thing I noticed this past Sunday during the service was the congregation *singing*. You all really sang out on *Hark the Herald Angels Sing!* We rejoiced! What is it about joy that makes us want to sing out? Have you ever noticed Mary's song of joy in Luke Chapter 1?

- ⁴⁶ And Mary said.
- "My soul magnifies the Lord.
- 47 and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior,
- ⁴⁸ for he has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant. Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed;
- ⁴⁹ for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name.
- ⁵⁰ His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation.
- ⁵¹ He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts.
- ⁵² He has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly;
- ⁵³ he has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty.
- 54 He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy.
- 55 according to the promise he made to our ancestors, to Abraham and to his descendants forever." (Luke 1: 46-55 NRSV)

What made Mary so joyous that she couldn't help but sing? It certainly wasn't her "station" in life. Women in Mary's day were not given much recognition. They were mostly overlooked, to be honest. Mary was also an unwed pregnant girl, who lived in a culture that would have not only looked down on that, but *could* have stoned her to death. How does she sing with all that going on? Maybe you have wondered how you could sing a song of joy this Christmas given your circumstances. And what's the key to Christmas joy, anyway?

I think it starts with the first word of her song (*Magnificat* in Latin). "My soul magnifies the Lord." Here's something for us to reflect on this Advent: What are we "magnifying" in our lives right now? Our problems? Our own little corner of the world? What would happen if the Lord was the absolute focus of our attention?



The Heart that Grew Three Sizes, Wednesdays in December!




Rediscover the gift of Advent that comes without packages, ribbons, and bows.

UMCOR and Disaster Relief for Kentucky

Dear Friends.

The nation awakened this past Saturday morning to the news that during the night and early morning hours, tornadoes had wreaked havoc in parts of Tennessee, Kentucky and several neighboring states. Lives were lost, buildings destroyed and communities devastated. Bishop Bill McAlilly, who oversees the Tennessee and Memphis Conferences (which will become the Tennessee-Western Kentucky Conference on January 1, 2022) and Bishop Leonard Fairley, episcopal leader of the Kentucky Conference, both anticipate a long recovery process for the communities most affected by the tornadoes.

As the news of the aftermath of the storms continues to unfold, our hearts break at the pain, trauma and suffering caused by these tornadoes. We want to do something to help those who are hurting. Yet we are not sure what to do, especially during this early phase of the recovery process. At times like this, I am so thankful for the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR), our church's humanitarian arm. UMCOR has already made emergency grants to conferences to help with the immediate needs of survivors and will continue to be partners in the recovery process for the long haul. Here are some additional actions you and I can take today to make a difference in this situation.

- 1. Pray for the people, communities and churches affected by the tornadoes.
- 2. Assist our Conference in collecting UMCOR Hygiene Kits. These and other Disaster Response supplies can be dropped off at our Disaster Warehouse in Decatur. As always, please call the Warehouse at 256-341-9961 and coordinate with the volunteers before you make a drop-off.
- Give to UMCOR's U.S. Disaster Response and Recovery through Advance #901670.
- 4. Donations also can be made directly to the Kentucky Conference's Disaster Response Advance 200902, Tennessee-Western Kentucky Conference's Disaster Response Fund, the Missouri Conference Disaster Response, the Arkansas Tornado Fund and the Illinois Great Rivers Conference Disaster Response Ministry.
- 5. When the affected Conferences deem that the time is right to extend an invitation to early response (ERT) and volunteers in mission teams, consider participating in rebuilding efforts.

During this time of year, Christ-followers are reminded that God is with us in the birth of the Christ Child. Matthew 1:23 reads, "Look, the virgin shall conceive and *bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel" which means, "God is with us."*

God's presence is often manifested through our words and actions. May those who have been devastated by last weekend's storms experience Emmanuel "God is with us" through our words, prayers, gifts and service.

It is a joy to serve as your bishop.




