"When Christmas Isn't Christmas"

The heart of the story of *How the Grinch Stole Christmas* is the TRUE meaning of Christmas. Isn't that where we are headed in the season of Advent...towards Christmas – the REAL Christmas? Along the way, though, we will prepare. We will start with ourselves, understanding that there is a little bit of "Grinch" in most all of us. We have all had times the last couple of years when everything felt wrong. We felt grumpy during "the most wonderful time of the year."

And sometimes we have false memories of the Christmas story. We *think* we know the story – but is the Christmas story we remember *really* the Christmas story? The Scripture for this Sunday is a great example. It is the story of Magi... And of King Herod (who was worse than the Grinch at his grinchiest).

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, ² asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage." ³ When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; ⁴ and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. ⁵ They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet:

⁶ 'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah,

are by no means least among the rulers of Judah;

for from you shall come a ruler

who is to shepherd my people Israel."

⁷ Then Herod secretly called for the wise men@and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. ⁸ Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." (Matt. 2: 1-8 NRSV)

Remember how I said we *think* we know the story? Here's a quiz: How many Magi are there? "Three," you say. Could be. But the Bible gives no number. The number three comes from legends and maybe from the three gifts. What were their names? "Gasper, Melchior, and Balthasar (who was a black man)," you say. Could be. But the Bible gives no names. That's all legend. What were the Magi's occupations? "Kings," you say... humming "We three kings of Orient are..." Actually...the Magi were many things, but they were not kings.

Will the real Christmas story please stand up? We will talk about that this Sunday, the Second Sunday of Advent. Join us!







The Heart that Grew Three Sizes, Wednesdays in December!




Rediscover the gift of Advent that comes without packages, ribbons, and bows. We don't know why the Grinch hated



A Message from Bishop Debra Wallace-Padgett

Dear Friends,

II Corinthians 5:17 is one of my life verses. "So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new."

The Greek word Paul chose for new in this verse is kainos referencing a new creation that has not existed previously. This has greater implications than if Paul had instead used neos, meaning new in an already established category.

The biblical concept of kainos new is a pillar of Christian doctrine. Since God is about the work of making us new every day, we are transformed throughout our lives into a new creation, continuously growing in our resemblance to the one we follow, Jesus Christ. Evidence of this transformation is seen in our words, attitudes, actions, and lifestyle.

One way that we open ourselves to experience kainos new is by practicing the spiritual discipline of reading Scripture. This is because we encounter God is in the pages of Scripture. And each time we meet the living God, we are changed.

With that in mind, I invite you to join me in reading through the Bible together as a North Alabama Conference in 2022. This initiative which was first launched in North Alabama by our Adult Ministries Team is a way in which we open ourselves to experience God's presence and kainos new on an individual basis and as a conference.

While we will be reading the Bible through the year from cover-to-cover, each week participants will read from the Gospel, Law, History, Psalms, Poetry, Prophecy and the Epistles. A detailed reading list will be made available after registering for Read Together 2022.

I have discovered first-hand how formative it is for an individual to read the Bible cover-to-cover each year. This is multiplied many times more as we Read Together as a North Alabama community.

Many thanks to the Adult Ministries Team, chaired by Stephanie Sparks and staffed by Assistant Director of Communication Lyn Cosby, for their work across the years on the Read Together initiative. The team will be publicizing the details of Read Together 2022 in the near future. In the meantime, please prayerfully consider joining me in reading through the Bible in 2022 as we continue to become kainos new in Christ as individuals and as a North Alabama community.
