

What may happen if we receive the Lord's Supper in an unworthy (unprepared) way?

a.) We sin against Christ and receive it to our judgment

b.) As a result weakness, sickness, and even death may follow

1 Corinthians 11:24,25 "This is my body. . . . This cup is the new covenant in my blood."

a.) Those who believe in the real presence of Jesus' body and blood.

1 Corinthians 11:28 A man ought to examine himself.

b.) Those who can and have examined themselves.

A: Young children, those with cognitive disabilities, dementia, Alzheimer's, etc.

c.) Those who are in complete and total agreement with one another concerning what the Bible teaches.

Matthew 18:15-17 "If your brother sins against you, go and show him his fault, just between the two of you. If he listens to you, you have won your brother over. But if he will not listen, take one or two others along. . . . If he refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if he refuses to listen even to the church, treat him as you would a pagan or a tax collector."

Based on Scripture the WELS/ELS practice "close communion"

Something done out of LOVE for

- 1. God's Word,
- 2. the souls of others who might eat and drink judgment on themselves, and
- 3. our own souls as we strive to avoid false teaching.

Why does Jesus invite us to receive the Lord's Super often?

a.) We daily sin much

Why does Jesus invite us to receive the Lord's Super often?

Matthew 26:28 "This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins."

Matthew 11:28 "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest."

b.) Jesus reassures us of his forgiveness and gives us spiritual rest in this sacrament.

How does our order of service naturally help us prepare for receiving the Lord's Supper?

- **◆**Confession of sins
- Absolution (announcement of forgiveness)
- ◆Bible readings and sermon
- ◆Repeating Jesus' words of institution


Agree or disagree? We should be able to attend the Lord's Supper in any Lutheran church.

Martin Luther wrote in his Large Catechism that if you do not feel as if you need to go to the Lord's Supper often, "Pinch yourselves and see if you are still flesh and blood. ... In the second place, look around to see if you are still in the world. Or, if you do not know whether you are, ask your neighbor." Why do you think he suggested such things?



What does God teach us about receiving Holy Communion?

God teaches us to receive Holy Communion in faith with those who believe the same as we do so that it is not a judgment but a blessing for us.
