

From Mrs. Melott...

The 5-day class has been very busy during the month of September. Our Bible stories have been focusing on sin in the world and our need for a Savior. The children are learning that they sin every day and need to ask God for forgiveness. They are also learning that God loves them no matter what. One of their favorite songs is "Nothing Can Keep Us From the Love Of God".

In math the children have been working on AB patterns, graphing, one-to-one correspondence, making designs with pattern blocks and writing the number 1 and 2. The children love the handson learning, and are very excited when it's math time. In reading/literacy we have been working on putting a line under a picture and drawing a connecting line from left to right. The children don't realize that when they are doing these things they are actually getting ready to read. We are also working on writing and recognizing the straight line letters, and on the concept of big, medium and small.

Every week we have a theme, and we do activities that go along with the theme. For our apple theme we talked about the different parts of an apple, and then we cut them in half and used them to make apple print windsocks. We also made yummy applesauce. Now that we are in the season of Fall, we have been making things with leaves. Our favorite project was making leaf prints with real leaves. Along with this theme we played different math counting games and worked on tempo as we recited the rhyme. We also worked on our fine motor skills by making small balls of playdough to "fill a bucket with water".

This year's mission focus is Costa Maya Ministries. During Parent Chapel on October 1st & 2nd we showed a video to introduce our parents to this ministry. Afterwards the parents helped the children make cards with their child's picture and information to send to the children in Costa Maya.

From Mrs. Tripp...

We have almost a month of preschool under our belts and the children are adjusting to the routines and habits of school. It is a blessing for these children to begin their school years in this Christian environment that exudes love and encouragement. The students have continued their learning of the Bible with the important Old Testament stories of Noah, the Tower of Babel and Abraham. Pastor Roloff captures the attention of the students with his weekly chapel that includes a message filled with images on a screen that conveys the Bible message.

The Pre-K class has begun the work of writing letters and numbers. We have used multi-sensory approaches including playdough and wood pieces to help us think and feel how the letters L and F are made. The children are hearing the sound of the letters, while they make the letters. This class has learned about how apples grow, and have listened to the legendary story of Johnny Appleseed. We are exploring Space and practicing the numbers 1 and 2 with crayon rubbings. They created their own planets with watercolor paints and coffee filters. Zoom, Zoom, Zoom, We're Going to the Moon was a favorite song we sang.

The Preschool students are beginning to identify their names! This has been a big focus for us and some parents have been impressed. One parent commented how her child knows his name begins with the letter "A". She said, "and now he will be learning Chemistry and Algebra?" Not quite! Our learning has included the theme of apples, sorting them into small, medium and large, thinking about their color and how they grow. Recently we have focused on colors. The Little Red Hen was the book of choice on red day. Their fine motor skills have been encouraged through scribbling, coloring and using a Q-tip to glue.

I NEED MORE ... I Need More... FAITH

"I Need More faith." I can't imagine any honest Christian who wouldn't say a hearty "Amen" to that statement. Because of the common weakness of our sinful, human nature, the fervent request that a greatly distressed father made to Jesus regarding his son's great need and his own weakness of faith has often struck a chord: "I do believe; help me overcome my unbelief!" (Mark 9:24)

Notice how that statement is punctuated with only a semicolon regarding his faith, but an exclamation point with regard to his unbelief. Unfortunately, that's the reality of the faith-life of God's people. We wish our own faith was punctuated with an exclamation mark or at least a simple period. But we know a question mark suggesting uncertainty or doubt gets in the way too often.

Just about every Sunday the worshipers in our churches make a confession of faith with the Apostles' or Nicene Creed. The key truths of the Christian faith are very briefly and yet adequately summarized in those statements. There are no exclamation points in either of those great, ancient creeds—just commas and periods that acknowledge the basic scriptural facts. That's an important aspect about saving faith: knowing the truth about the true God and the Savior he has given us.

Since this faith is totally a gift, we need to keep going to the Lord with this request, "Lord, I do believe; help me overcome my unbelief!" We keep having a problem with unbelief because it's such a natural part of us. Faith is a supernatural thing, and it is kept alive and strong only with the supernatural Word of our supernatural God.

The most important thing to remember about faith is that it derives all its strength from its object, that on which it rests. As a famous preacher once said, "It is not your hold on Christ that saves you; it is Christ. It is not your joy in Christ that saves you; it is Christ. It is not even your faith in Christ that saves you, though that be the instrument. It is Christ's blood and merit." There might indeed be many instances where our trusting faith is shaky, but the Savior and his promises are rock solid. With this subject of faith, it's most important to hear him speak with exclamation points, "I love you! I have saved you! I will never let you go!"
