SUNDAY MORNINGS CORE OF EXPLORE

Sunday Mornings is a place where teens will be exposed to the Word of God and challenged and equipped to think through it as they walk through the Bible with caring adults and mentors.

ELEMENTS OF EXPLORE

1. Loving & Knowing God

We were created to love the Lord our God with all of our heart, soul, mind, and strength (Matthew 22:37-38) and Jesus said "Now this is eternal life: that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent (John 17:3). We were made to love and know God; there is no greater joy in life than this. One of the primary means that God has used to help us get to know and come to love Him deeper is His revelation about Himself through Scripture. TNT Explore is about helping teens grow in their knowledge and love for God by guiding them through His Word.

2. Equipping

Sunday Mornings is a place where teens are equipped with the entire counsel of God's Word (Acts 20:26-27). We believe that all scripture is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work (2 Timothy 3:16-17). In his farewell to the elders, Paul said "Therefore I testify to you this day that I am innocent of the blood of all of you, for I did not shrink from declaring to you the whole counsel of God" (Acts 20:26-27). In this statement Paul shows the seriousness with which He took in delivering the whole Word of God to the believers. TNT Explore seeks to equip teens for the life that God has called them to by guiding them through the entirety of God's Word. In addition to walking them through the entire counsel of God's Word, we also want to equip the teens to be able to interact with God's Word on their own. TNT Explore is about equipping the teens with God's Word and the tools and skills to study it on their own.

3. Christ-Centeredness

Not only is all scripture useful for living a Godly life and growing in our love and knowledge of God, but we also see that all scriptures point to Christ (Luke 24:27), the author, and founder of our faith. TNT Explore is about helping the teens see the glory of Christ in all the scriptures and showing them the truths of the gospel throughout all of God's Word.

4. Encouraging

Hebrews 10:24-25 urges us: "And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds. Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another-and all the more as you see the Day approaching." **TNT Explore is about coming alongside of teens and encouraging them**

I. Ministry Description

The TNT Wednesday night program takes place every Wednesday at Community Bible Church from 7:00 PM to 9:00 PM (doors open at 6:30 PM). Every Wednesday teens experience free time, singing, Bible lessons, and small group discipleship led by caring adults.

Quick Word About "In or Out"
