ollowing the events of Resurrection
Sunday, we enter into the season of
Eastertide which ends with two significant
events for the early church: the ascension of
Jesus to heaven and the coming of the Holy
Spirit at Pentecost. These two events serve as
a driving force for the earliest Christians. In the
ascension, they are challenged to take the
message of Christ to the ends of the earth. At
Pentecost they are emboldened with all they
need to rise to that challenge. They are driven,
they are passionate, and they are pulled by
their vision of a transformed world.

Today, we celebrate these early church events on these special Sundays, but often don't take direction from them. We know Jesus is with us – found through the guidance of the Spirit – but we can't often think of what possible path could lay ahead of us as we follow him.

This is where we have to do our best to see the road ahead through the eyes of Christ. Jesus never looked a situation as hopeless. Yes, there were moments where he hit a wall and had to go in another direction (his first home-visit to Nazareth in Luke 4 comes to mind), but he never gave up. If there was no way forward, he looked at the path from a different perspective and always found a way to build the kingdom

of God in the lives of those around him. There is no dead-end in Jesus' eyes, only moments where we stop to listen for the Spirit's call toward what we might not yet be seeing.

Vision is not just something that affects individuals, it also affects groups of people (like congregations) as well. When our vision is cloudy, we find it hard to see a way forward. When it is clear, we move forward, but always find ourselves wondering when it will be less clear again.

Benson Baptist has been through moments of great clarity, and moments of murkiness. We have often found ourselves facing deadends and feeling stuck. This "stuckness" would be OK, if we didn't follow the Jesus who always saw a way forward.

Not knowing what's next is a part of life. There will always be moments where we can't see the road ahead for the fog of uncertainty. The thing is, we follow a Jesus who promises that he's always with us to guide us — and that his is a road that never ends.

The early Christians believed this and it drove them. Just like the quote from Steve Jobs, they really cared about what Jesus had called them to. It pulled them forward at every turn— even in the face of the most uncertain paths that they would ever walk.

Today, we have to ask what we care about, and how it pulls us forward. Are we just going through the motions of faith/church, or are we being driven forward because of what Christ has called us to? Are we standing still at a dead-end, or listen for the call of the Spirit toward something new?

The road ahead is a hopeful one. It will not be easy – or always clear – but there is always a way forward if we keep the vision of Jesus that sees hope in the world — and always pulls us forward.

ts been almost two decades since the term 'Associate Pastor' could be found in the Benson Baptist Church staff list. Back then, the Associate Pastor position was generally a melding together of two different ministry areas in BBC life (Children, Youth, and Music, for instance).

A month ago, upon the resignation of our Nursery Coordinator, we started to think about what it might look like to re-dream our ministry to children and youth. After much conversation on many levels, the title 'Associate Pastor' once again returned to BBC.

The purpose of the new Associate Pastor for Children, Youth, and Families is to focus on a more holistic and over-arching ministry of spiritual formation from birth through transition to post-high school life. In this, our children and parents have the opportunity to work with the same minister from their very first Sunday through graduation. There are many advantages to this, the highlight being that we will be able to cultivate a faith journey for our children and youth that is not just about coming to church, but also about growing in faith in every aspect of their lives — with the shepherding of their parents as much as their ministers.

This position was created with our Minister of Youth and Children, Reverend Will Raybon, in mind. His already exceptional work with our children and youth, added to his ministry background, excitement about spiritual growth, and love for the church, gave credence to his shift into this new role.

In addition to his continuing his current work with youth and children, he will also now work with parents of expecting and nursery-aged children, assist with visiting our homebound membership, and provide continued worship leadership alongside the senior pastor.



The View from Debbie's Desk

hen we moved from California to North Carolina I just figured I would get a job as a teacher's assistant like I had been for the 7 years before. (I had no vision that I could do anything else.) I did apply for some positions but then Don saw this ad in the paper for a church secretary (guess where). I said to him "I've never done anything like that before. I can't do that." He knew that I had no confidence in myself and kept encouraging me to pray about applying. Which I did then I talked to Judy Johnson (Personnel Chair). She sent me an application, I filled it out and mailed it to the church.

Soon, Judy called: they had not received the application. She sent me another application. I filled it out and took it directly to the post office and mailed it. Judy called: they had not received this application either. This time she told me to come to the church office and fill one out here and leave it. They did receive that one.

So, I ended up applying 3 times. But as a side note after I started, I went to the Post Office to get the mail and asked them if they had any mail in the back because Kendell Cameron, the pastor, had told me they hadn't received much mail in the last couple months at the church. They went back and looked and told me no, there wasn't any mail in the back. Three weeks after I started working, they found our missing mail, 2 big boxes of mail— with all the bills that hadn't been paid and guess what? My other 2 applications!!

When I got this job, I had a vision of what a church secretary should be like. One thing was not getting close to the church members. I told myself. "Debbie, you don't need to get close to the people at BBC you need to keep it on a professional level. That's the way a church secretary should act." But part of my job was/is to minister to church family that call and want to talk. A church member started calling me right after I started working here. She wanted

Someone to listen to her. I told her "I think you should talk to the pastor." "She said no I want to talk to you." She would call 3 or 4 times a week and talk for 30 – 45 minutes each time. After a few weeks I went to Kendell and told him the situation and told him that I wasn't getting my work done. He said to me. "You keep talking to her. Don't worry about the work. Part of your job is to minister to church members/church family. You are the first voice they hear when they call, and it comforts them knowing you care about them enough to listen to them."

I've always loved my job and the church members/church family on a professional level. (or so I thought) But after he said that I let my heart open up to Benson Baptist and when I did, it caused a flood of emotions. I couldn't pretend that I only loved BBC on a professional level anymore. My vision back then was wrong, and thankfully God had other plans for me and showed me just how wrong I was.







- Kitchen & Family Night Organize and prepare church-wide meals— particularly on Sunday nights in the spring/fall.
- Lord's Supper Prepare communion elements for worship.
- Memorials* Decide how funds given in memory of someone are allocated.
- **Music** Work with Todd on the music ministry of the church.
- **Nursery** Work with Will on our ministry to infants/toddlers.
- Outreach Work with our homebound members and organize our visitor ministry.
- Pastor-Church Liaison* The Senior Pastor's Support Team.
- **Personnel*** The "HR" committee of the church.
- Properties Work with Jacob on facilities' needs.
- **Scholarship** Review applications for our Campbell University Scholarship.
- Sound Sound booth techs for Sunday worship and other events.
- **Ushers** Greeters for worship services and offering attendees.
- Van Review the church-owned vehicle for maintenance.
- Youth & Children Work with Will for ministry to our elementary through teenage attendees.


