THIS WEEK'S LESSON: GOD'S MATH WORKS



IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

People will know God loves them if we show love to others and tell them about Jesus. God does not want us to "divide" and ignore people who might be different from us. Acts 8:26-40, Philip and the Ethiopian



M HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Do some people watching with your kids this week. How many people do you see who look like your family? How many do you see who are different? How many of those people does God really love?



AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- What did Philip do when he saw the Ethiopian reading the scripture?
- Why didn't Philip ignore the man and walk away from him?
- How can we become people who are more loving to people different from us?



AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

"But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." Matthew 6:33 (NIV)



MPARENT TIME:

What you need to know:
