

Praying for the Unsaved

People who are not Christians fall into two camps: those who have never heard of Jesus and those who reject him as Lord and Savior. For the first group, ask God to raise up, equip and send

missionaries and evangelists to reach them, and to open their hearts and minds to the Gospel.

The second group is a tougher nut to crack. Those who have heard



the Gospel but rejected God's salvation in Christ have already hardened their hearts against him. They have a buffet of bad reasons why. The "science" crowd insists that all life is the result of millions of years of random genetic mutations and that the entire universe just exploded into existence, no God needed. The Apostle Paul wrote in Romans 1:18-20 such people "suppress the truth," that God has made the truth plain to them: "For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities—his eternal power and divine nature have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made, so that people are without excuse." ask God to remove the spiritual blinders Satan has placed on their eyes and the fog of deceit he has placed in their mind. Ask God to help them realize how limited their knowledge and experience is and to truly approach him with an objective, open mind.

Another group of folks think God may be real but don't seek him because they don't know how to find him and don't want to risk wasting time and effort only to come up empty. God wants us to know him and we can find him, but he wants us to make a sincere effort. "You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart." (Jer 29:13) Pray for God to help them realize that He is real, and nothing in life is more important than knowing who he is and what he wants them to do. Pray also that He will give them the courage and motivation they need to seek him and the faith to believe they will find him.

Then there are those who have convinced themselves that they will go to heaven because they are "good people" or because they do good works. In reality, they want the benefits of eternal life but the only god they serve is themselves. Isaiah wrote, "All of us have become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous acts are like filthy rags; we all shrivel up like a leaf, and like the wind our sins sweep us away." (Is. 64:6) Jesus said that such people "...honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me." (Mat. 15:8) Pray for God to show them how they are deceiving themselves and how they live not for God but for their own desires and goals, and to give them a contrite heart and motivate them to confess their sins and ask Jesus to be their Lord and Savior. \(\mathbf{T}\)
