

After we complete Genesis we plan to have a potluck dinner together or go for ice cream and decide whether to go on to another book of the Bible or do a video-based study. Both are a good way to get closer to Jesus.

Some Christians don't appear to have read that passage or, worse, have read it and forgotten it. Maybe your life has been pretty good so far. You, like the average churchgoer, show up faithfully 1.2 times each month. You have money in the bank, a great job, a loving wife and kids, one or two vacations each year, and perfect health. Why mess with success, right? Jesus put it this way, in verse 17: "You say, 'I am rich. I have everything I want. I don't need a thing!" But keep reading, because Jesus then lowers the hammer: "And you don't realize that you are wretched and miserable and poor and blind and naked."

You may rightly ask how that can be when your life is going so well. It's because Jesus is talking about your relationship with him, not your relationship with the world. If you truly have accepted his priceless gift of grace for the forgiveness of your sins, eternal life, and adoption into God's family, then how can you consider God of no greater importance than a painting on your wall or a vase on your table?

If you are indifferent toward God, Jesus will take action, as he said in verse 19: "I correct and discipline everyone I love. So be diligent and turn from your indifference." Notice that he doesn't say to go to church more, tithe more, or to show the fruits of the Spirit more. Such things are important, but only when they result from a life lived for God instead of for yourself. He is to be the center of our world, the focus of our existence, the light in our darkness.

King David, whom God described as "a man after my own heart," wrote in Psalms 27:4: "One thing I ask of the Lord, this is what I seek: to live in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to gaze upon his beauty, and to seek him in his temple." When you feel that way about God, you will find your life producing genuine fruits of the Spirit and enjoying life in a way you have never known. So jump off that fence and start living for and loving the God who loves you and died for you. \P
