

## Why did God let this happen?

That question has been asked throughout history by people afflicted with injuries, disease, catastrophes, failed marriages, the loss of a loved one, a job loss, and so on. The question has been

asked even by longtime Christians who, like everyone else, have been affected by the Corona virus problem this year.



Those who ask that question

## **Big Changes for Base Camp**



The Base Camp course is designed for new believers who have just started their faith journey, for seekers who want to know more about God, faith, or the Bible, and for returners who are looking to reset their spiritual compass. Experienced guides lead you through discussions on faith, life, and growing in Christ. No question is off limits.

Classes have been held at Laurel Ridge church the past few years but cannot be held there for the foreseeable future as a result of Covid-19 shelter-in-place advisories. The Base Camp team is preparing to offer Base Camp online via the Zoom videoconferencing application. Zoom is easy and fun to use. If you are not familiar with Zoom, the Base Camp team will be glad to provide you with simple-to-follow directions or personally walk you through the process of using Zoom to attend meetings online.

Another big change for Base Camp is that the course has been condensed from nine weeks to four.

from me? How long will I store up anxious concerns within me, agony in my mind every day? David pours out his heart to God for a few more verses, then concludes, But I have trusted in your faithful love; my heart will rejoice in your deliverance. I will sing to the Lord because he has treated me generously. How is David able to go from tears and trembling to praising and thanking God? Because he remembers who God is. He remembers that God loves him faithfully. He remembers God's promises and knows God is trustworthy. In response to God's love, deliverance, and generosity, David rejoices and sings praises to God.

We can follow David's example no matter what troubles we face. God is not offended when we cry out to him in hurt, anger, or despair. The turning point comes when we remember who he is and decide to place our trust in his faithful love, rejoice in his deliverance, and praise him for his generosity. When we do, God transforms us: our confidence grows, our hearts become calm, and our joy increases.

Jesus said in John 16:33, *In this world you will have trouble. But take heart, for I have overcome the world.* We've seen a ton of trouble in 2020 and the year is only half over. Life may get worse before it gets better. Decide now to trust God and lean on him, not on your own understanding, and he will give you the peace you desire.
