Summary of Just War Criteria

- 1. War should only be waged for just cause, on account of a grievous wrong by the attacked
- 2. War must only be waged as a last resort
- 3. War must only be waged upon the command of a rightful sovereign.
- 4. War must be primarily defensive
 - a. Only under dire circumstances can it be preemptive
- 5. War should be waged only if there is a reasonable possibility of success
- 6. War should be waged only with support of the people
- 7. War must not produce evils and disorders graver than the evil to be eliminated
- 8. Acts of war should be directed towards enemy combatants, and not towards non-combatants
- Combatants may not use weapons or other methods of warfare whose effects cannot be controlled (e.g.biological weapons).
- 10. Combatants are not permitted to attack enemy combatants who have surrendered and those who have surrendered must be treated humanely

Summary of Pacifist Principles

- 1. The waging of war by a state, and the participation in war by an individual are absolutely wrong, under any circumstances
- 2. "Thou shall not kill" means "Thou shall not kill."
- 3. Pragmatic pacifism holds that the costs of war and interpersonal violence are so substantial that better ways of resolving disputes must be found.
- 4. A good end cannot sanctify evil means; evil must not be done that good may come of it
- 5. If one uses violent, coercive, or unjust means, whatever ends one produces will necessarily be embed in that injustice
- 6. Returning violence for violence multiplies violence
- 7. Only love can conquer hate
