"Right now, we are preparing for our summer schedule, and we will be teaching about the parables."

During the 10:30am worship service, children ages 4-3rd grade are dismissed before the sermon and led downstairs for a "mini church service" designed just for them. "We follow an order of service that includes a call to worship, time for prayer and praise, and a lesson that covers important questions of faith," explained Children's Ministry Administrator Lisa Young.

In the fall and spring, the ministry also offers a Sunday PM program featuring fun games and fellowship at the same time many Lifeline groups meet at the church. Summer activities include VBS in June, a pool party in July, Bike Night in August, and a Kickoff event at the Magic House in September.

"We believe it's our purpose to create an environment where children feel treasured," Melissa added. "We want them to learn about God's great love for them and how to share it with others."
