

## Online Application for Admission

- Complete the application\*
- Submit the application fee of \$20
- Submit a biographical essay

Write a biographical essay that is between 300-500 words in length (typed, double spaced) and includes:

1. Your personal salvation testimony
2. An explanation of why you want to enter into a True North College program of study at this time.

- Submit a church essay

Write a church essay that is between 200-400 words in length (typed, double spaced) and includes:

1. What ways do you serve in your church?
2. What ways do you engage in fellowship with others in your church?

- Submit a Pastoral Reference Letter from a Pastor in your church.
- Have your official high school transcript, official record of GED, or college transcript sent directly to True North College.
- Call the Admissions Office to schedule an interview with an admissions counselor.\*\*
- Receive and sign the Student Handbook.\*\*\*

*\*Note: Students seeking to take courses for credit must apply for admission and be accepted to True North College by completing the Online Application for Admission. Students who only want to take courses for audit do not need to complete the application or be accepted.*

*\*\*The interview is very much a part of the application process. Through engaging in the interview prospective students may come to an understanding that the True North College certificate or diploma programs do not fit their needs or desires. Similarly, True North College admission counselors may come to an understanding that the prospective student does not fit into the True North College programs. Some prospective students, for example, may simply fit more into the category of auditing courses (a student does not need to be accepted into the College via application in order to take courses for audit). In either case, the prospective student would not be accepted into the True North College certificate or diploma programs. Students will be notified within one week after the interview of the status of their application and acceptance.*

*\*\*\*The Student Handbook documents the general policies of True North College regarding the expectations of student behavior and the implementation of academic rules. Prospective students must be willing to submit to these expectations and rules; hence, the signing of the handbook as a requirement for acceptance.*
