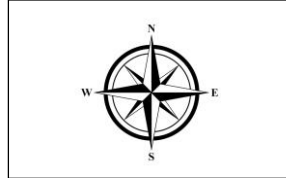


Children will learn about the seasonal and daily weather patterns in the United Kingdom. They will also learn about other hot and cold areas of the world.



Key facts

The **weather** around the world is not all the same. It changes depending on where you live in the world and the season.

The **equator** is an imaginary line around the middle of the earth. Countries near the equator are very hot, countries far away, for example the **North Pole** at the top and the **South Pole** at the bottom of the earth are very cold.

Types of Weather

Rain - drops of water that falls from the clouds

Hail - small lumps of ice that falls from the clouds.

Wind - movement of air.

Thunder - a loud rumbling noise.



Key vocabulary

Weather - the condition you may notice when outside.

Map - a drawing of a town, country or the world. Maps show you where roads, mountains and rivers are.

Globe - a ball/sphere with a map of the whole world.

Equator - imaginary line around the middle of the earth.

North Pole - the area at the top of the world furthest from the equator. It is very cold.

South Pole - the area at the bottom of the world furthest from the equator. It is very cold.

United Kingdom - England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland make up the United Kingdom.
