

Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2017 Continuum of Care (CoC) Program Competition

On Friday July 14th, the 2017 NOFA - HUD Competition was released. Please see the link below to read the NOFA in detail before applying to the COC.

The CoC, Renewal and New Project applications are scheduled to be available in e-snaps on or after Tuesday, July 18th. Please carefully and thoroughly read the FY 2017 CoC Program Competition NOFA.

Although the available amount of funding is expected to be sufficient to fund anticipated eligible renewal projects in the FY 2017 funding process, HUD will continue to require Collaborative Applicants to rank all projects in two tiers.

* Tier 1 is equal to 94% of the Annual Renewal Amount (ARA) for all permanent housing and HMIS projects eligible for renewal, up to \$443,018 for Monroe County.

* Tier 2 is the difference between Tier 1 and the CoC's ARD (\$28,278) plus any amount available for the permanent housing bonus, up to \$35,361 for Monroe County.

Renewal projects should go into e-snaps and begin the process as soon as it becomes available. Those projects are: Sun Houses, Peacock for Chronic Homeless, St. Bedes, St. Theresa, Don Moore, and Seebol Place.

New projects that have never registered in e-snaps will need to do so in order to complete a new project. Resources are posted at <https://www.hudexchange.info/programs/e-snaps/guides/coc-program-competition-resources/#general-resources>

The COC is required to submit its completed application to HUD on or before September 28, 2017. HUD requires that all project applications are required to be submitted to the CoC no later than 30 days before the application deadline. Finally, the CoC is required to notify, in writing outside of e-snaps, all project applicants who submitted their project applications to the CoC by the CoC-established deadline whether their project application(s) will be accepted and ranked on the CoC Priority Listing, rejected, or reduced by the CoC with 15 days of the FY 2017 application deadline.

To comply with HUD's requirements, the following will be the MCHS COC timeline:

8/7: COC executive committee will review the scoring criteria for applications

8/10: COC Board and Planning committee will approve the scoring criteria

8/25: Renewal and new projects must be submitted to the MCHS COC via e-snaps on or before 5:00 PM

8/28 - 9/8: Oversight Committee will review, score and rank the projects

9/12: COC will announce the scores and project rankings

9/27: COC will complete submission and priority listing in e-snaps
