TEACHER SPOTLIGHT: MRS. REEBEL

Mrs. Reebel was born in Burbank, California. The unique fact about her birth is that she was born in the same hospital that Walt Disney died in, just nine minutes after his death. She was even on the same floor of the hospital,

because they put him in the maternity ward.

She attended public school while living in Southern California. Being a social butterfly, Mrs. Reebel greatly disliked school, because it cut into her social time. After eighth grade regained an interest in school, enjoying English Literature and History the best. She enjoyed sports, participating in Softball and Cheerleading. She was also in Student Council, French, and Drama.

He was determined to stop any bullying on campus and wanted campus to be a welcoming place for students. His devotion to God and the Bible gave him very high standards Bible classes.

In addition to his love for the school, he was also very committed and loving toward his family, always referring to his wife as his “sweetie.”

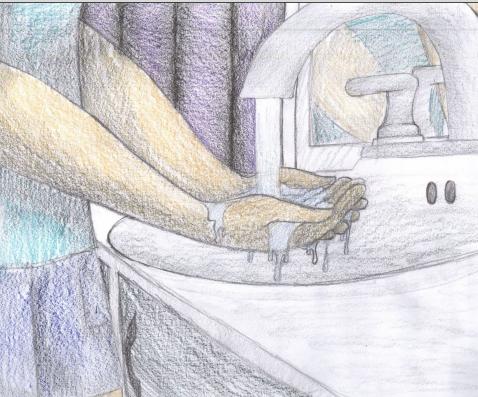
The next time you walk through the gym, remember this astounding man, his love for our school, and, most importantly, his love for God.

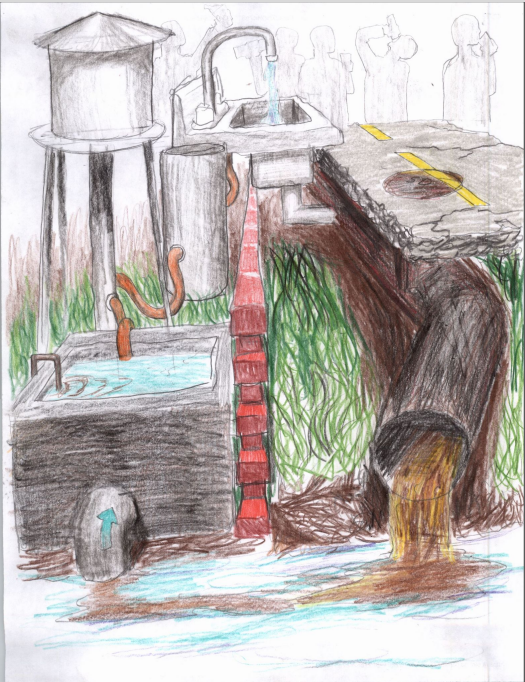
Students from New Hope jumped on the idea and rushed to finish their drawings and turn them in. Excitingly, *three* New Hope students won!

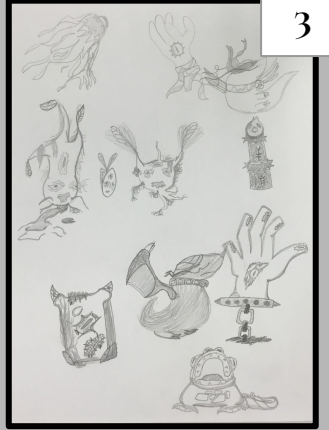

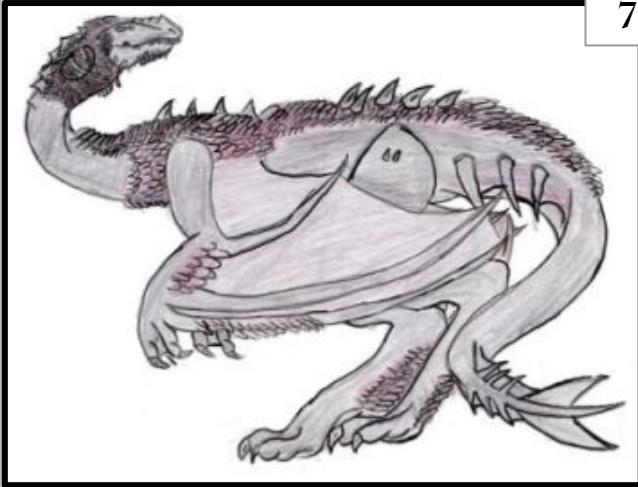
