

**Lake Cumberland Area Development District
Transportation Committee Meeting
Thursday, December 5, 2019 @ 12:00 Central Time**

MEETING MINUTES

Chairman Billy Guffey, Mayor of Burnside called the meeting to order at 12:00 p.m. in the Large Conference Room of the Lake Cumberland Area Development District in Russell Springs, Kentucky with 24 persons attending. Chairman Guffey welcomed everyone then turned the meeting over to Mr. Charlie Allen, Department of Highways District 4.

Mr. Charlie Allen, Department of Highways District 4 gave project status updates for Green and Taylor Counties. Mr. Allen discussed projects in construction, intersection improvements, and HSIP (Highway Safety Improvement Program). Mr. Allen introduced Mr. Brad Bottoms and Mr. Paul Sanders. Mr. Bottoms and Mr. Sanders made comments on highways, bypasses, streets and bridges.

Mr. Jeff Dick, Department of Highways District 8 gave project status updates for Adair, Casey, Clinton, Cumberland, McCreary, Pulaski, Russell, and Wayne Counties. Mr. Dick discussed Future Lettings (Proposed Dates), Projects in Design Status, Ongoing Construction Status, FD05 (MP) Resurfacing Project, HSIP (Highway Safety Improvement Program) – Project (Federal funding safety projects).

Next Chairman Guffey introduced Ms. Jessica Bray from Cumberland Valley Area Development District Transportation Planner. Ms. Bray gave a very informative power point presentation over Bicycle and Pedestrian Planning. With there being no comments Chairman Guffey thanked Ms. Bray for her presentation.

Next Chairman Guffey introduced Ms. Judy Keltner, Director of Community & Economic Development with the Lake Cumberland Area Development District. Ms. Keltner gave updates for Mayors and Judges on Recreational Trails and Land & Water Program. Ms. Keltner stated that Recreational Trails is a federal highway funding source that does an 80-20 match, which can be a cash match or an In-Kind match. For example, if you ask for \$100 they would do 80% and the city/county would do the other 20%. Land & Water is a National Park Service with federal funding source that does a 50-50 match. Ms. Keltner also stated that the funding for both of these have opened up and gave deadline dates for each program as well. Recreational Trails deadline is May 1, 2020 and the deadline for Land & Water is May 29, 2020. Ms. Keltner offered services of the Community & Economic Development department to help any city/county that would be interested in these programs and ask that they would let her know by the end of January 2020.

In Other Business Ms. Hoskins informed everyone that the next Transportation meeting will be held the first Thursday in March. At that time the voting members will be updated. Ms. Hoskins stated that she would send an email closer to time as a reminder.

With no other business Chairman Billy Guffey thanked everyone for coming and adjourned the meeting at 12:40 p.m.
