

**Lake Cumberland Area Development District
Transportation Committee Meeting
Thursday, March 1, 2018**

MEETING MINUTES

Chairman Eddie Rogers, Taylor Co. Judge-Executive called the meeting to order at 12:00 p.m. in the Large Conference Room of the Lake Cumberland Area Development District in Russell Springs, Kentucky with 22 persons attending. Chairman Rogers welcomed everyone.

Chairman Rogers stated that currently Judge Executive John Phelps is the Vice Chair. Chairman Rogers made a recommendation that Mr. Phelps remain as Vice Chair for the Transportation Committee and asked if there would be any nominees for anyone else to be Vice Chair. With there being none Chairman Rogers asked for all in favor of keeping Mr. Phelps as Vice Chair. With all being in favor and no one opposed, Chairman Rogers thanked Mr. Phelps for serving/accepting the position of Vice Chair.

Mr. Jeff Dick gave updates on existing project in both District 4 Highway Office and District 8 Highway Office. Descriptions of the updates are attached and made part of these minutes.

Chairman Rogers then introduced Ms. Amber Hale, Adopt a Highway Coordinator with the Department of Highways District 8. Ms. Hale gave an overview on Adopting a Highway. The Adopt a Highway is a 2 year non-binding contract with KYTC. These highway adoptions do not include parkways or interstates. Kentucky has participated in this program since 1988 and has approximately 700 groups in the state and those groups take care of about 4,800 miles of roadway. She went on to explain that anyone 13 years of age can become a part of the Adopt a Highway program. Anyone that is under the age of 18 years old will have to be accompanied by an adult at all times. The two year non-binding contract can be renewed and within that contract they ask that the interested parties adopt a minimum of 2 miles. KYTC does provide all groups with trash bags, vests and road signs to use during pickup and to return that which is unused. They recommend pickup to be a minimum of 4 times a year. Ms. Hale went on to say that in District 8 there are over 50 groups with approximately 700 miles of pickup. Ms. Hale stated that if anyone has any question or needs further information, please contact her at the Department of Highways District 8. Chairman Rogers thanked Ms. Hale for coming.

Chairman Rogers then turned the meeting over to Ms. Kasey Hoskins, LCADD Transportation Planner for other business. Ms. Hoskins stated that in the packet that everyone received there are two lists. One is Major Freight Users Inventory and the other is Major Traffic Generators Inventory. The last time these lists were updated was in 2016. Ms. Hoskins let everyone know that the updated lists are coming due within the next couple months and if anyone has any industry or manufactures that need to be added, taken off, or had an address change please let her know. Ms. Hoskins stated that the lists are sorted by county. Anything that would generate a

large amount of traffic for the road that the business or manufacture is on needs to be listed so the road can be prepared to withstand that particular type of traffic.

Next, we have the Recommended Highway Plan. This plan has not been finalized and approved yet. Ms. Hoskins has a copy of each county for anyone that need to see their county's highway plan information. Ms. Hoskins gave a brief overview of LCADD's new website at lcadd.com and how to find the Recommended Highway Plan. Next scheduled meeting will be June 7th.

With there being no other business, Chairman Eddie Rogers, Taylor Co. Judge-Executive ask for a motion to be made to adjourn the meet. Motion was made by Wayne County Judge-Executive, Mike Anderson. Seconded by Green County Judge-Executive, John Frank. All in Favor. Motion Carried. Meeting was adjourned at 12:35 p.m. Central Time.
