The church heating and stove were also inspected for code compliance and safety, by our insurance company. This is a Vermont State requirement.

We passed but were urged to improve the location of our shut off switch, and to insulate the pipes.

The kitchen sink drains were power jetted by Dorr Oil prior to the chicken pie supper, the vestry entry was painted, and the handicap ramp installed.

We carefully review these needs and try to determine how we can assist, if not financially, at least through our prayers. Our opportunities are limited by the funds we are able to collect, so we continue to appeal to you for whatever support you can pledge. 
