A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR REBECCA

Dear Church Family,

February has me contemplating the coldness of the winter landscape and my desire for all things warm. I like slippers, blankets, cups of steaming tea, and a warm shower or bath. These things ease the tension of tight muscles and help me relax and feel a sense of belonging instead of merely survival.

It is not just the weather that is cold; our social climate has been a bit chilly lately too. Some people are isolating to try to protect their health. Others have jobs that bring them into the company of others regularly, but find things quite tense there. People have been in survival mode for a long time and their nerves can be a bit frayed.

How can we be warm-hearted when things around us are cold, physically and emotionally?

I believe it is the love of God inside us that generates warmth that benefits us and others we encounter. In Romans 5:5, we read ~ *“We are able to hold our heads high no matter what happens and know that all is well, for we know how dearly God loves us, and we feel this warm love everywhere within us because God has given us the Holy Spirit to fill our hearts with his love”* (The Living Bible). God’s love is warm, and when we are filled with it, we are warm people. Our mouths are not full of complaints and icy remarks that sting others. Instead, they are full of gentleness and patience that can wrap the people who hear see the light in our eyes and hear our words with comfort like a blanket.

2 Corinthians 13:11b-12 (TLB) says ~ *“Live in harmony and peace. And may the God of love and peace be with you. Greet each other warmly in the Lord.”* The colder the climate is, the more people are drawn to warmth. We need it to feel at peace. Whether we are in our homes most of the time or out there in the wide world, we all have opportunities to share the warmth of God’s love with people we encounter. First, we need to soak in it ourselves, then we can notice the ways God’s Spirit nudges us to share the warmth ~ in conversations in person or on the phone, through letters or cards, as we go about our work, and when we come home to our loved ones. May we greet each other warmly in the Lord whose love is our source of warmth. And may we gather together with others who have warm hearts to feel the comfort of a community formed by God’s love and welcome those who want to come in from the cold.

A Few Highlights from Annual Meeting of Sunday, Jan. 23, 2022

Reports, including the budget committee report, were reviewed and accepted without further discussion. The Nominating Committee reported one empty spot on Christian Education and one on Prudential Committee. Both committees would welcome an interested volunteer.

The By-Laws Committee had a few recommendations.

- a). The audit committee will consist of three persons: a 1 yr. term, 2 yr. term and 3 yr. term starting this year 2022 with the three year term to be chairman. Carol Lattuga will assume 1 yr. term, Jim West will assume 2 yr. term and Judy Koch will assume 3 yr. term.
 - b.) The Missions Committee will designate funds as FBC Missions and ABC Missions. All offerings for FBC Missions will be dispersed by our local church committee and will include Jen Pedzinski and our World Vision Student, Leon. ABC Missions designates our quarterly offerings (WMO, OGS, RRMO, and AFC) and adding one more yearly offering whose funds will be earmarked for United Missions Basic. The term Benevolence will no longer be used.
 - c.) It was voted to change the date of Annual Meeting to the first Sunday in February with corresponding changes in by-laws pertaining to details of annual report and meeting details.
- Lorraine Wilkins, who is chair of the Prudential Committee, brought up several other issues on the Prudential agenda including sanctuary window repair and roof repair which we will be hearing more about in the near future.

PRUDENTIAL COMMITTEE

The Prudential Committee met on January 6 in the vestry.

During our **Old Business** session, the Sanctuary walls continued to be a topic. The wallpaper behind the paint was saturated and therefore, had to be dried out before being painted again. No word from the insurance company on whether they will reimburse us for the painting. Lorraine will contact the insurance company once again.

The new microphones for the choir have arrived and Jeremy has set them up. Now everyone will hear the beautiful voices of the choir.

We have FINALLY gotten to the bottom of the smell in the kitchen. It is the grease trap by the kitchen dishwashing sink. It has been cleaned and WHAT A DIFFERENCE! Lindy Mylott has agreed to clean it for now. THANK YOU! We will appreciate this act of kindness.

The year end audit has been completed. Jenny Sprague graciously agreed to complete this task along with Carol Lattuga. Thank you, ladies!

Carol Lattuga, Barb West, and I met with Rebecca to discuss her contract as the previous contract ended in August, which I then brought back to Prudential.

It was determined that the contract should go until January 2023 because we vote on it at the Annual meeting and it currently ends in August, therefore, this contract would be from August 2021 to January 2023. During this contract discussion, I discovered that the frequency of the contract review appears two different ways in the By-laws. I brought this matter up to the By-laws Committee when we met. All other changes were discussed at the Annual Meeting.

The Roof Committee continues to work on obtaining estimates/quotes. We are currently looking at solar shingles, slate, standing seam, asphalt shingles and rubber slate tiles. The current roof is in VERY bad shape and will only continue to deteriorate.

A discussion of food scraps in the kitchen led to the Prudential Committee deciding that we will no longer put them in the freezer. There are two choices: put them in the garbage or take them with you to your composting bin.

New Business found us discussing proposals for By-laws. We created wording for the new Audit Committee and fixed the Pastor's contract review years.

I then gave a demonstration of how to clean the small air filters. They can be vacuumed off a few times, but then need replacing. We are now in the needs replacing phase.

Barbara West requested permission to host a Cancer Support Group in the Vestry. Details are still being worked out. The Prudential Committee whole heartily supports her in this endeavor.

Next Lisa went over the final version of the proposed budget for 2022.


