A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR REBECCA

Dear Church Family,

I am glad that Thanksgiving comes at this time of year for us. It is good for our souls to concentrate on God's blessings as the days grow shorter and colder and the beauty of the autumn leaves gives way to starkness.

The verses that I'd like to share with you are from Ephesians 5:18-20.

18 Do not get drunk on wine, which leads to debauchery.
 Instead, be filled with the Spirit,

 19 speaking to one another with psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit.
 Sing and make music from your heart to the Lord,
 20 always giving thanks to God the Father for everything,
 in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

My first thought was to begin with the second part of verse 18, focusing on being filled with the Spirit. However, I decided to include the whole verse, because the reality is we are always looking to fill the empty spaces in our lives. Alcohol is the filler of choice for some, but many other things can be used to try to comfort ourselves during bleak times. Overindulgence in food, social media, entertainment, substances or sleep, overwork, overattachment to a person... can all entice us away from the One who can fill us with awareness of God's presence the true source of comfort and joy.

God knows we need to encourage each other, and one of the best ways we can give encouragement is to sing with each other. I've noticed the Spirit flowing through our worship times at church when we sing hymns and praise songs together. It's a delight to have so many of you coming together to sing choir songs for a full hour on Thursday evenings, and sharing those songs in the worship services too. We have so much to inspire our praise because of how our Lord Jesus Christ has saved us, making it possible to live in harmony with God and each other. Let's keep making music and praise from our hearts to the Lord, friends!

PRUDENTIAL COMMITTEE

The Prudential Committee met on October 20th at 4 pm in the vestry.

During **Old Business** many updates were given. We are still waiting to hear from the insurance company about the leak in the roof. I will contact our insurance adjustor again to see if we can go ahead and have the wall repaired. The Prudential Committee has formed a committee to find options to replace our Sanctuary roof as it is long past due. The Committee is aiming to have information ready for the annual meeting. Ray Koch, Jeremy Crumb, and I make up this committee. If anyone else is interested, please contact me. The update on Orkin is that there has not been any activity up to this point, inside the church, but much in the bait boxes outside. However, now is the time that the mice will be heading inside, so we will have to wait and see what transpires. There is good news about the "smell" in the kitchen. GSK did come and take care of one of the drains, but there may be a different more permanent solution that they can do. That is in process. As far as the audit goes, Lisa has been exploring different reports that the computer can generate that would make the audit much quicker, easier, and as thorough. A quick note about the automatic water dispenser in the food prep sink in the kitchen. If it comes on and does not go off, the batteries in the faucet that controls this function are probably dead. There are two options if this happens to you: 1. Turn off the water under the sink making sure to let me know and 2. Unscrew the top and take out the casing that holds the batteries and replace them. Currently, those of us that said we would bring the batteries can't seem to remember. LOL Lindy will get some to replace the ones not working and have a set of extra ones. In getting ready for the budget meeting, we discussed how much it would

cost to have someone do additional cleaning. We are thinking about \$30 an hour and perhaps 2 times a month for maybe a total of 6 hours. This is still in discussion. Paul Bauers does volunteer each week to do a great deal of cleaning, but there are still areas that need attention. He cannot be expected to do any more than he does. THANKS PAUL! We appreciate all of your efforts. Maurie volunteered to cut the peonies by the side door in preparation for winter and the beautiful flowers we get to enjoy next year. We also discussed that there is a smell coming from Joy Hall. For now, we will keep the door shut. Lindy will check the dehumidifier to see if it is still working, needs a new filter, or just needs to be replaced.

In **New Business**, I explained that the right side of the oven is not working at all. It was discovered during the last dinner. Lisa has called Suburban Propane and they will come on November 10th to fix it. Maurie will come to the church to let them in. We then discussed shoveling for the winter and ice melt. We do have some ice melt, but Lindy will pick up some so we are not cut short as many groups meet at the church. We need to find out who does or is able to shovel this winter. We need to make sure BOTH front doors are shoveled. The snow and ice on the second door that we do not use is taking its toll. These doors are very old and would be extremely expensive to replace. When the front was painted this summer, they did what they could to get them "up to par". Maurie has volunteered to be on the Budget Committee for next year and Dottie volunteered to be on the Nominating Committee if they want more members.

The next meeting is set for Thursday, November 11th, hopefully at Maurie's House. Committee members will be apprised of our meeting place.


