LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

There are a great number of accomplishments in 2009 to celebrate. Listed in a random order are some of the important items. Last spring, the wind blew portions of the roofing off of the Wren cabin. John Rankin, Cheryl Pelton, and Arthur Hall replaced the roofing with a more wind resistant type. The Annex roof suffered wind damage to one third of the North West side, so John and Arthur repaired that roof with new shingles donated by Moore Lumber. Roger Christenson was elected to fill the membership chair, and Doug Stephens was elected to the board as Secretary. The Shawnee Historical Society joined the PCHS as a sub-group. This union will enable the Shawnee Historical Society the use of the non - profit 501 (c)3 status of PCHS; plus other benefits. The PCHS web site is up and going well thanks to Jim Sapp. Rodger has set up a Face Book account for PCHS and may set up an eBay account if we provide auction items and a separate checking account. The grant for the Salt Works Ranch is near closure because the work is complete for that part of the project. Another grant is being applied for to use for restoring the interior of the main house. PCHS is the non-profit flow through for those grants. Cowboy Christmas was resurrected and hosted by the Rustic Square LLC and Destination Bailey. PCHS did their part as the Memorial Park was open to all that day. Doug Stephens provided hot cider to all that visited the caboose. Pat Mauro hosted some exiting and successful field trips this past summer. The pot luck supper held at the Community Center in Shawnee was an excellent event that should be scheduled each year about the same time. A portion of a movie was shot at the Memorial Park on August 29, 30. The movie will be available in early summer. Numerous notices will be posted when the movie is available. We made some friends with the producer and director of the movie. Some of the actors would be interested in doing a fund raiser for PCHS. Let's put it together! The GOCO grant application was delivered to the County on the last day of the deadline. What a squeaker that event was. Meeting that deadline would not have been possible without the intensive effort from the Destination Bailey members lead by Susan Lambert and supported by some PCHS board members three lots into one large one will be included, and be approved after the rezoning application is approved. PCHS membership is increasing. Progress on other items such as the Como Depot, Glen Isle etc. cannot be included because of the lack of space.

The handcart event planned for September on Kenosha Pass was not held as PCHS could not provide the requested liability insurance at that time. There are plans in the works to resolve the liability issue; one is to purchase the handcart if it is for sale. Updates on this item will follow from Pat Mauro over the spring.

Some events in the planning stages for 2010 are Casino Night in March at Sweet Fanny Adams; and possible flea market or garage sale events or both to be planned early in 2010, one event in the spring, and one event in the fall.

The chair position in PCHS is open for a liaison member between PCHS and PCHPAC. We do need a member to represent us at the PCHPAC meetings. So please someone, volunteer for the honor of representing PCHS.

In brief the grant will provide the funding to repaint the Keystone Bridge and replace its deck and build a new steel stairway at the South end of the bridge. It will provide the funding to add public restrooms to the Annex and cover the cost of the new roof for the Annex. Some good hiking trails will be build on Morrow Mountain and accessed from the Keystone Bridge. Picnic tables will be replaced with high quality types; and the Memorial Park will be completely landscaped with plants native to this area. Much more is available because of the grant and updates will be sent out as progress moves forward. 2010 is going to be a very busy year of activity for PCHS. Please help PCHS in any way you can as we will need it. 2009 was a challenging, but a highly successful year. 2010 looks to be more challenging and will be much more successful. I am looking forward to the excitement and to completing the many different projects made available to us by the GOCO grant.

At this point, the best video we have is from the VHS version made by Helen. The version we had made from the original movie footage, by



Susan Gilbreath, had worse quality than the VHS version. The soundtrack did seem better however, and with the assistance of Society Membership Chairman, Roger Christenson, we have run off copies of the soundtrack. We have taken both copies of the soundtrack to RP Studios in Pine Junction/Hidden Valley Ranch. Bob Hockenberry, owner of RP, is working on cleaning up the soundtracks in his studio. He believes he will be able to clean up the noise in the old soundtrack, and enhance it. This should help to clear up the vocals that Helen made in 1954, along with other audio levels within the soundtrack! We will then merge that with the video from the VHS version, and we hope that will be an enhanced product, from what the original is now! Helen's legacy will live on!

The Como Depot has made tremendous strides towards being preserved! They have won 2 State Historic Fund grants this year! The building has been leveled now, and the foundation has been restored, by the expert work of Mr. Mike Perschbacher! The foundation has been kept in the original style as it was originally, per Historic Fund specifications. The last grant, just awarded last week (December 7), will be to have the roof replaced! The progress being made on the depot has been astounding! It's a great testament, of how a historic preservation project can come together, with the assistance of many community groups assembling to complete the project! The icing on the cake is, Mike Pershbacher's Grandfather and Great Grandfather, both worked for the Railroad, in the Como Depot! Plans are starting to come together at the Como roundhouse also!

I had discussed a few options with Dr. Brantigan, at Railroad Day in August, which I had mentioned in the last newsletter. We are narrowing down what the Dr. would like to move forward with now. At this point, it looks like plans to add the boiler room back onto the

roundhouse will commence. Other projects include, more work on the turntable pit, more cleanup, and possibly laying rail in the yard!

Another project that has made great progress is the Salt Works Ranch! Former PCHS President, April Bernard, has been spearheading that project, along with owner Ty Fanning. The exterior of the grand old house has now been restored! It is truly wonderful, to see an extraordinary Park County relic being preserved. I would also like to thank April Bernard for her McGraw Park improvement plan which she assembled in 2001.

Her project was the seed that greatly enhanced our chances to win the GOCO grant we just won! I don't think we could have assembled the grant with the speed we did, if we did not have her project ready to lay on the table. Thanks April!

There are more projects going on around the county, such as the Shawnee Historical Society, Lake George, Guffey, Alma, Fairplay, and Hartsel, and Garo! Please contact me if you would like more updates on these projects, and to coordinate helping with them. This is a large county; with so much history hiding in the nooks and crannies, there is never a shortage of fun, rewarding, preserving projects for us to work on!
