Motion to approve minutes of the January meeting by John Rankin, second by Susan Lambert. Motion carries.

Treasurer's Report: John Rankin

Linda Balough indicated the balance of the Park County Historic Preservation Advisory Committee grant could be used for other landscape work at Glen Isle. Brush removal along the Platte was suggested. Art spoke to Barbara Tripp and she is considering this. Pat and Yvonne suggested other landscaping or interior work. Art says when he was working on the tree he noticed the foot bridges could use repair. Also the steps leading to the downed tree stump could use repair. PCHS would need to send a proposal to Park County Historic Preservation Advisory Committee for the use of the remaining funds. If funds not used at Glen Isle they may be used for McGraw Park.

Fund Raising:

Old Business.

Rezoning of Morrow Mountain on hold. County indicates it is an incomplete application as Marrow Mountain is alleged to be part of a 1981 illegal subdivision. PCHS disagrees as the land was transferred from Marrow to McGraw to PCHS. Art to follow up with county to resolve.

Lot consolidation is postponed until rezoning complete.

New Business

GOCO Grant:

GOCO grant steering committee meeting held to start the process.

Disparate accounts still exist with donations.

The GOCO grant agreement was signed by the county commissioners on February 3, 2010. Art met with Steve Harris the architect for the restrooms. It is possible electric baseboard heat will be used. If restrooms closed in winter we may consider leaving the annex building restroom in place.

Art, John and Doug met with the Bailey Water District to discuss using a triangle of their land for McGraw Park parking. It is the fenced triangle off 68. PCHS will investigate the use of our liability insurance for this as requested by the water district. PCHS would place garbage cans at the lot. Bailey Water District indicated that they may need the land for future expansion of the water plant. They further indicated that safety is an issue with the plants operations. Bailey Water District didn't want unattended children or pets to be injured if trespassing on plant property or works.

Art will get a plat of the proposed parking area for Bailey Water District and the insurance. Then Pat will contact our insurance agent to pursue.

Public Relations Committee

Chair Position open. We need a chair to help publicize events in local print and internet media.

John Rankin indicated that having an entry in the Flume the day before an event isn't sufficient for maximum results. Blurbs should be placed two or three weeks in advance. Same with the High Timber Times, he continued. John also indicated a broadcast email to members would be effective.

Susan Lambert indicated the new Platte Canyon Area Chamber of Commerce web site has a community calendar and scrolling news lines.

Art then proposed we join the PCCOC. Pat made the motion to join and spend the \$30.00 to join the PCCOC and Leona seconded. Motion carries.

Other places for getting the word out was the website southparkevents.com, pinecam and parkbull.

Postcards could be sent to members without email addresses.

Flyers and or posters could be used at willing local businesses.

Yvonne, Pat and Susan indicated they could coordinate efforts in this area.

E-Bay Auction:

E-Bay auction site with mission fish donations to PCHS is an approved project for Roger Christenson. Pat indicated we could sell PCHS merchandise E.G.. the C&SP book.

Consensus was reached that a separate bank account with Art, Pat, John and Roger as signers should be used for this. Bank of the West is PCHS' bank.

The Glen-Isle Tree

To the Editor,

The dead, giant ponderosa pine in front of the historic Glen-Isle Lodge was becoming a threat to the lodge as it was located close enough that should the wind blow it over towards the lodge much damage to the lodge would be done. It was cut down by LAM Tree Service of Evergreen, and then members of the Park County Historical Society blocked the tree and carried it to McGraw Memorial Park. The tree was donated to PCHS for firewood for the wood stove in the Annex building. A grant from the Park County Historic Preservation Advisory Committee provided funds for the cost of cutting down the tree. The tree was first limbed to relieve weight and better control the tree's direction of fall.

A 1910 picture of the tree shows that the top of the tree was at the same height as the roof of the lodge. When the tree was cut down it was only a few feet taller but much larger in girth. The tree grew on a rock outcropping so it had a large root that grew around the edge of the rock and into the soil at the edge of the river. The diameter of the tree at the stump was 42 inches; the girth was 164 inches.

A special thanks to the crew that blocked the tree and did the cleanup of the area. The cleanup crew included John Rankin, Ken Purdue, Doug Stephens, Pat Mauro, and Arthur Hall.
