



THE ATTACK ON THE ROBBER'S CAMP

"Go above Geneva Gulch a little ways and you'll find where one of our horses mired down and we had to leave it there. At the head of the gulch, you turn to the right and follow a mountain around a little farther. And just above the head of Deer Creek, you'll find an old prospector's shaft running back into the mountain at about timberline. It's back there in the hole, Pard. We walled the hole up with stones and stuck a butcher knife into a tree about four feet from the ground, broke the handle off and left it pointing to the mouth of the hole."

Mortally wounded John Reynolds told this to Albert Brown in 1871. (one of several stories)
