With the Christmas Season fast approaching, Council spent a great deal of time talking about our COVID protocol at its last meeting. As we all know, it is complicated; and Council is taking their responsibility to everyone seriously.

Please know that we are listening to all of you -- with some folks wanting to get rid of masks, and other folks only coming to in-person worship because they feel safe because everyone is wearing masks.

Data tells us masks not only protect the person wearing the mask, but more importantly protect those nearby. Data also tells us that under the right circumstances, even those vaccinated can spread the virus when not wearing masks. So, vaccinations and masks give the best combination of protection for all.

Even though Polk County numbers have recently gone down, with folks traveling from all over and gathering indoors for the holidays, the numbers are expected to rise again. And just this week, hospitals are seeing an uptick in numbers.

With those things in mind. . . and the fact that the number of folks in worship will increase, there will be more families in our pews, and we all want to sing more for Christmas. . . Council has decided to stay the course with masks, for now; so we can all joyfully and safely celebrate the birth of the Christ Child. Council will review where we are at again in January.

So, here's what that means for now:

- Continuing to socially distance from each other
- Continuing to wear masks in worship
- Asking folks to sing softly
- Encouraging folks to use hand sanitizer before and after communion, etc.
- Continuing to take contact information for visitors at the door
- Indoor Fellowship Hall events with masks when not eating
- Spread out and social distancing in Fellowship Hall
- Small groups (if all vaccinated) may decide among themselves to wear masks optionally

As we wait for the coming of the Christ Child this Advent, we are being asked to wait to give up our masks for an hour or so of worship for the sake of one another. We thank you for your faithful service as you take care of yourselves, and your neighbors in Jesus' name.

### Cápsulas del Corazón — QUE SIGNIFICA LA NAVIDAD?

Llegó la Navidad! La época más hermosa del año, una festividad que no quisiéramos que acabara. Algarabía, fiestas, regalos, parrandas, luces por doquier y un sin fin de cosas más. Pero, nos hemos detenido a pensar, que es en realidad la Navidad? Cuál es el verdadero significado?

En Lucas 2:6-7 dice: Y, mientras estaban allí, se le cumplió el tiempo. Así que dio a luz a su hijo primogénito. Lo envolvió en pañales y lo acostó en un pesebre, porque no había lugar para ellos en la posada.

La Navidad es un momento glorioso en el que celebramos el nacimiento del niñito Jesús. # Snippets from the Heart— WHAT DOES CHRISTMAS MEAN?

In Luke 2:6-7 it says, "And, while they were there, the time was fulfilled. So she gave birth to her firstborn son. She wrapped him in diapers and lay him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn."

Christmas is the glorious time when we celebrate the birth of Jesus. We must honor the birth with a message of faith, hope, and love in order to unite ourselves to God, sharing traditions as a family and sharing the importance of giving and receiving. Love, of feeding the spirit, and enjoying the little things in life, is the best gift we can offer. Remember values such as union, peace and solidarity, religious according to beliefs. and moving away from worldly and pagan forms, and focusing on living with true faith.

Advent is celebrated at this time and marks the beginning of the Liturgical Year,

beginning on Sunday, November 28 and ending on December 24. It is the four Sundays before Christmas and announces the arrival of our Redeemer. The meaning of Advent is to enliven in believers the expectation of the Lord. But beyond that, it is a time when we must reflect as Christians, correct our actions, ask God for forgiveness for what we have committed, and commit ourselves to making a change in our lives. In this way the Messiah can be born in your heart.

And why do we join the day of the Three Kings to Christmas? In the Gospel according to Matthew 2:112: When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of King Herod, some magi came from the east to Jerusalem, saying: Where is the king of the Jews, who was born? For his star we have seen in the east, and we come to worship him.

January 6 commemorates the arrival of the Magi to the manger where the Messiah was born, to honor him and bring him gold, incense and myrrh. This celebration is considered an Epiphany of the Lord. lt is а divine manifestation because he made known the birth of the Son

of God. In Isaiah 60:1-6 it says "Jesus is born, with the wise men of the East all the peoples of the world are invited to enjoy and celebrate the glory of God."

Let us pray: Lord and Holy Father: May this beautiful time that is coming, give us peace, love and above all the hope we need to be people of faith and union as you wish. Help us Father to honor our Christian traditions and values on this feast of the Birth of Jesus by loving our neighbor, forgiving and asking

for forgiveness, cleansing our soul so that you can be born in our hearts and thus be able to proclaim your word and continue your work according to your will. Help us to be like The Magi, always look for your star and reach you to be able to give you the best of us. In the mighty name of your son Jesus Christ, Amen.
