Quinlan's Corner — You're Never Too Old to Learn (or Teach)

Pastor Joe and Church Council President Kathy Dierker both have been going well beyond what one might reasonably expect them to do in the face of the deadly and perhaps worsening COVID crisis that threatens us all. Since the Church reopened in the fall, Pastor has taught one set of Adult Sunday School lessons, and is busy teaching a second set. In between, Kathy taught a set of lessons herself.

While the Church Council has established a strong set of protocols designed to keep us safe, we all are aware that there are no guarantees, that no safety precautions can ever be full-proof. It seems clear to me that both Pastor and Kathy see themselves called to a higher duty: to risk their own health and safety in the interest of spreading the Word of God.

Pastor is currently teaching a course in peace keeping through February in-person in the Fellowship Hall from 8:45 am until 9:45 am on Sunday mornings, and on-line on Wednesday evenings from 7:00 pm until 8:00 pm. Attendance at the former is sufficiently limited so that participants are well spaced apart from one another; of course, they're wearing masks as well. The on-line version is held by way of both ZOOM and telephone. Both formats enable dialogue among students and between them and Pastor. Quilters are savers, so in that tradition we have been saving our scrap fabric and batting to put together 30 doggie beds using donated pillow cases which were delivered to the Polk County Humane Society on Dundee Road in Winter Haven in January. They greatly appreciated our donation. Quilt Sunday was early this year, January 31st, due to the loss of a drop off point and the scheduling of the trucks from Lutheran World Relief



(LWR) to pick up the quilts. We are currently beginning to prepare to pack up the quilts on Monday, February 1st and on Tuesday, February 2nd we will take them to Good Shephard Lutheran Church in Tampa, our drop off point this year. Resurrection Lutheran Church in Winter Park has withdrawn from a drop off point after many years of service. We thank them for their years of serving as a drop off point. In February we will be meeting on the first Wednesday, February 3 and the third Thursday, February 18. We will begin with house-keeping chores: cutting batting, putting together the sheets that were the incorrect size by sewing additional strips and patches to make them usable as backings. We also prepare any fitted sheets to make them backing ready. We will also be cleaning and organize the quilt closet. Won't you consider joining this worthwhile program?

Gifts From God and How Do We Know What is a Gift?

In 1981, my family and I returned to the United States after two decades of foreign residency in five different countries. Upon returning to the U.S. I decided to earn a Doctorate degree in Ed. Admin. I went to the U. of Utah in Salt Lake City, with a Master's in Ed., but was informed by the Dean of the College of Ed., this field was overcrowded with Doctors in education; and I should go to the College of Business Admin. I was dismayed because I had no interest in Business, so I returned to the classroom. My Principal, a white Mormon woman, asked why I was not in a doctoral program? When I shared I had attempted to enter the U. of U. Doctoral program in Ed. Admin and was turned away, she asked me if I understood what had happened to me? I was puzzled. She told me I had been discriminated against, because I was a woman and I was black. The same man had asked her, when she applied for the Program, "Why don't you go home and be the good Mormon wife your husband married?" I was disturbed by how disarmed I had become while I lived in the open acceptance abroad, as an American first, then as an educated woman. My ethnicity did not come into play with how I was perceived. What was I to do in moving forward with my career? What were my strengths and how should they be developed? How do I discern personal biases blocking the system? I applied to Brigham Young University, (a Mormon University) where I would be more alert to biases in the System. There were none that thwarted my education. I earned an Ed. Specialist degree (-13 hrs. of Ed. D.)

There is an educational tool used in helping people determine what career choices they should consider, by comparing their interests (and their aptitudes) with people in different careers having the same interests. It is called *The Strong / Campbell Interest Inventory. People have things they naturally like to do which they are generally good at doing. This is a confluence of interest and aptitude (I call them gifts from God). I took the Inventory to learn more about my strengths and areas which "were not my cup of tea" and my service to Lamb of God aligns with my God given talents. They follow:*

Artistic: (Very High Similarity 66%) - Dramatics 71%, Art 68%, Writing (High) 63%
Enterprising: (High Similarity 59%) - Public Speaking (Moderate High) 57%, Law / Politics
(MH 58%), Merchandizing & Sales (VH 62%), Elected Public Official (Similar 49
Social: (Average 53%) Social worker (58%); Elem. Tchr / Special Ed. (VH 59), School Admin
(MH 53%) YMCA /YWCA Director (VH 56%)

Since 1999, I believe I was sent to Lamb of God with my ethnicity, unique life and work experiences, organizational skills, education and driving concerns, using my gifts and talents. Lector

readings, drama and directing dramatic performances are tied to my love of performing arts. My education skills urge me to teach Adult Sunday School, English as a Second Language, coordinating & directing Outreach seminars. Serving on Synod and Church Councils for 6 and 12 years respectively, at A House Blest, as Communion Deacon and various committees to organize church wide special events and banquets, uses my gifts in administration & working with people. It also included directing 32 website upgrade videos and an on-camera video for reopening the church to the congregation which has been put on hold. Intercessory Prayer Deacon is an engaging personal service, since often the prayer comes to you from HIS Holy Spirit. I thank you humbly for your appreciation of my service and the lovely engraved clock. The Christian mandate of loving your neighbor remains an expectation, in personal interaction with others, and biases are antithetical. Christ's Ministry leads people to God's relationship with HIS creation, and love in service through Social Justice. Such service is not always welcomed by some in society, but is received well by those in need. We must use the gifts God has given us. HIS Holy Spirit helps us discern essential service and qualifies us. A bit of advice, " Do not ask for God's guidance, if you are not willing to move your feet " because HE will show you the unexpected. GOD'S WORK. OUR HANDS.
