From the Council

Under the leadership of our Interim Pastor, Pr. Cheryl Berner, your Church Council has begun the lengthy and detailed process of taking certain actions required by the FL-Bahama Synod of the ELCA so that the candidates referred to us by the Synod best match our ministry needs for Senior Pastor. This is a great opportunity to prayerfully discern where our church has been and where it wants to go. For example, do we want to emphasize growing our ministry for families with young children? If so, what are the implications for worship and other church activities? What kind of gifts will we need in a pastor?

This process involves two separate Lamb of God entities: your Church Council and the Call Committee. The first part of the process belongs to Council as they work to complete the Synod "Transition Process Check List." The purpose of the checklist is to get us as ready as possible to form the Call Committee, interview candidates and ultimately call a new pastor.

divided The list is into three categories: 18 administrative actions, 10 financial actions, and five key areas of planning. The Council has completed eight of the 18 required administrative actions and one of the required financial actions. These nine items were relatively easy to check off the list. Others will require considerable work, and some will not be completed for some time. One critically important financial action will be to clarify and reorganize our accounting structure; to that end, the Council decided at its most recent meeting to consult an expert on how best to do that.

Once these 33 tasks have been completed, it will be time for the Call Committee's work. At this point, the Council will recommend а Call Committee of 6-8 church members who represent a broad spectrum of the congregation for election by the congregation. The Call Committee's first task will be to gather input from the congregation and prepare the Congregational Profile for the Synod.

The Call Committee will then interview each of the candidates the Synod refers to This interview process will be us. confidential; even the Council will not be privy to the details. Because a great deal of work will have gone into matching ministry needs with pastoral candidate gifts, it is likely that the Council will then be able to recommend a Senior Pastor to the congregation; however, one or more additional rounds of candidate interviews is always possible.

The Council will continue to apprise church members of its progress as it works through the Synod checklist. At the appropriate times in the process, all Lamb of God members will be asked for their input.

If past is prologue, it may well be a year or more before we welcome our new Senior Pastor. Pastor Berner's role is to guide us through the process.

The Council will continue to proceed prayerfully. Please do not hesitate to talk with me or Pr. Berner, if you have questions. We will appreciate your prayers as well.

Pastor Cheryl L. Berner's Notes...

"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven. . . a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted. . . a time to tear, and a time to sew." (Ecclesiastes 3:2b, 7a)

Beginning in June we move into the "Sundays After Pentecost" season of the church year. It is also known as "Ordinary Time," because there are no major festivals. And by tradition, worship is often less formal liturgically — so you will notice there is no Hymn of Praise or Kyrie, and the Eucharistic Prayer is simpler on Sunday mornings.

This time in the church year is also known as the "Green Season," which is especially appropriate as we begin our journey together as Interim Pastor and Congregation. As this "Green Season" begins, we are reminded of the growing season — the soil is made ready, seeds are carefully planted, the sun and rain give nourishment for growth, and God breathes on the planting, SO THAT the land produces a good harvest for sharing.

So it is with Lamb of God in this time of transition. There is surely some uncertainty about what the future will look like, and even a bit of anxiety for some of us. But this time "In-Between" pastors is also a good growing "Green Season."

Much of our work together will be looking at what Lamb of God's ministry has been in the past and what we hope it will be in the future. It will be a time for us to lay the groundwork spiritually and administratively for healthy ministry with a new pastor. It will be a time to prayerfully discern who God is calling Lamb of God to be in this time and place. And it is surely a time to imagine. . . even re-imagine. . . how we might grow the ministry of Lamb of God, for the sake of sharing the love of God in Christ Jesus.

And so, this "Green" "In-Between" time is a gift. . . the soil is being prepared, and ministry seeds being planted. May we be nourished by God's Word and at Christ's Table. And may God's Spirit breathe on our work together SO THAT our ministry today and tomorrow may produce good fruit for sharing in Christ's name.

COVID-19 GUIDELINES UPDATE

Beginning with services on Sunday, July 4, we are implementing changes to our worship service recently approved by the Worship and Music Committee and the Church Council.

The rationale for easing some areas, and not others just yet, is based on current CDC, local health and ELCA guidelines -- which take into consideration increased vaccination rates, less emphasis on spread by touch, but continued emphasis on spread through breathing, and especially indoor singing in public settings.

With these things in mind, we are returning to our regular order worship with communion celebrated in its normal place in the service. We will still commune by station, but return to our after receiving seats communion; only new guests will be checked in when enter the building; thev the pastor and assisting minister will have the option to wear a mask and gloves only, and not a shield while serving communion.

These guidelines will remain in place for now: seating distances will continue to be marked off in the pews, masks will continue to be worn, there will be no passing of the peace or offering plates, no hymnals or other literature in the pews, and soft singing requested.

In addition, vaccinated small groups meeting in the building have begun to talk among themselves as to their comfort level with mask wearing and social distancing in their meeting.

Your Church Council will continue to monitor the situation, and will ease other guidelines as soon as it is safe to do so. The Council gives thanks for the many ways you continue to love and care for one another in Jesus' name in these challenging and ever-changing times.



Recipe of the Month Three Bean Pasta Salad

Ingredients

- 8 ounces uncooked small shell pasta
- 8 ounces fresh green beans, trimmed and cut into 1-in. pieces (about 2 cups)
- ½ cup thinly sliced celery (about 1 stalk)
- 1 can pinto beans, drained and rinsed
- 1 can red kidney beans, drained and rinsed
- 1 small shallot, minced
- 3 tablespoons rice wine vinegar
- 1 teaspoon lemon zest
- 2 Tbsp. fresh lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard
- 1 teaspoon honey
- ¾ cup olive oil
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- ½ teaspoon black pepper
- ¼ cup thinly sliced chives



Directions

Step 1—Cook pasta according to package directions. Drain and rinse with cold water; drain.

Step 2—Cook green beans and celery in boiling salted pasta water and cover until tender-crisp, about 2 minutes. Drain and plunge into ice water to stop the cooking process; drain.

Combine pasta, green beans, celery, pinto beans, and kidney beans in a large bowl.

Step 3— Combine shallot and vinegar in a medium bowl; let stand about 5 minutes. Add lemon zest, lemon juice, mustard, and honey, stirring with a whisk. Gradually whisk in oil until well combined; pour over bean mixture.

Sprinkle with salt and pepper; toss gently.

Sprinkle with chives, and serve immediately.
