Worship and Music Corner

Behind the scenes, the Worship and Music Committee has been hard at work for you. As a member of the committee, I would like to update you on just one of the items on our agenda: *improvement to the quality of sound of our worship service*.

Over the past couple of years we've had growing issues with various parts of our overall sound system. Some parts of the system have deteriorated with age (for example, our speakers) and others have needed some tweaking by a professional sound technician.

As we look forward, plan, and take steps toward being able to upload our services live (in real time) to the internet, our soundboard issues need to be addressed.

Here were the ongoing issues:

- The soundboard was not set up properly.
- Only 1 of the 3 hanging speakers were working. The speakers facing both right and left transepts, where our choir and hand bell choir sit, were not producing sound.
- Only a few of the microphone plugs around the church were working.
- Good sound levels were difficult to achieve for the pre-recorded messages and readings for the online services.
- A reduction in sound quality towards the back half of the sanctuary. The further back you sat from the front, the more diminished the sound quality you heard. This dynamic has impacted our sound booth personnel who work from the back of the church because they are not hearing the sound in the booth as it is heard in the front of the church. This, of course, created some challenges for them in getting the volume just right for the entire space: when they turned up the volume to be heard in the back of the church, the



- they turned up the volume to be heard in the back of the church, the front of the church received too much volume. (For the size of our worship space, our soundboard and speakers should provide quality sound throughout.)
- Difficulty with regulating the sound level and quality for the hearing assist system.

Though this may sound like a lot of bad news. There is good news!

We are in the processes of addressing these issues with the help of John Zelinko from Kingdom Audio Visual, LLC.

Mr. Zelinko has already made tweaks to the soundboard and equipment which have fixed most of the issues we were having. One of his recommendations was to replace the hanging

speakers which were showing signs of internal decay. Replacing the speakers and adjusting their angle will help to evenly distribute the sound throughout the sanctuary.

We are blessed to have an anonymous donor provide a generous gift to cover the cost of the new speakers.

Once the new speakers have been installed, the sound booth personnel and staff will receive training from Mr. Zelinko on the updates made to the sound system.

All of these efforts will provide you with better quality sound during worship services now, whether in-person or online, and pave the way for us to transition to online live streaming in the future.


Thanks in advance for your cooperation and let us all hope and pray that sometime in the near future we will be able to get back to normal.



After cutting the batting we quickly went to work putting together mission quilts. Then on Sunday, April 18

from 8:30 am till 2:00 pm the quilters sponsored a scissor and knife sharpening service to members and friends of the congregation provided by Joseph Hansel of Highland Sharpening. Thanks to the response from the congregation Mr. Hansel has agreed to return again next year to sharpen our scissors and knifes hopefully making it an annual event. The quilters can use your help, we are in need of new or gentle used sheets of any size that have been washed and free of stains. Please take a bag of fabric that needs to be cut into quilt squares [instructions provided in each bag] – this task can be performed at home. 3 large eggs 1 box cake mix (any flavor)
