You're Never Too Old to Learn (or Teach)

Have those of you who've not attended our Sunday Adult Bible Study seminars ever wondered what goes on there? Well, a lot does and I'm here to tell you about it. My hope is that your interest will be piqued sufficiently to give it a try.

While our staff always hews to the Word, we try to vary and approach the subject matter in new and creative ways. We went on a fascinating field trip in the not-too-distant past to supplement class time. There's often a film. There usually are handouts to take home.

Classes are held in the Fellowship Hall. They begin shortly after the last (and only during the summer) Sunday service. They're scheduled for one hour but occasionally run over a bit simply because people don't want to stop. After folks get a chance to pour themselves a cup of coffee (a Lutheran tradition?) or whatever other beverage is available and then choose from an array of pastries and such, we comfortably ensconce ourselves at the round tables there.

Classes on any particular subject matter may run from two or three weeks to six or more. Often, students have the opportunity to buy, at half price, the book the leader is working from.

The format is relaxed. Typically, leaders present an overview of the topic and then facilitate discussion. These are seminars folks, not traditional classes! While we're never too old to learn, some of us might be too old to sit in a classroom and listen to a lecture. So, our leaders facilitate discussion. Sometimes that discussion prompts folks to share personal stories. So, to some extent, we get to know one another. And that's a very good thing, even if you might want to strangle that very rare speaker who doesn't know when to stop!

All kidding aside, the essence of these seminars is that we learn and grow together. We make new friendships and enhance old ones. Won't you give us a try?
