103 Maori Achievement Procedure

NOTE: Our school identifies with the Moeraki Runanga and understands our obligation to support Maori to learn as Maori. A key resource is Kahikitia which should be used to guide decisions and approaches to lifting Maori Achievement. Maori learning as Maori.

OBJECTIVES

1. The school takes responsibility for initiating and maintaining consultation with Whanau/parents of Maori students to address important learning needs of our Maori students.
2. The purpose of the consultation is to help teachers gain a better understanding of the students and to engage Parents/Whanau of Maori students in supporting their children's learning, and to accelerate their children's educational progress and achievement. See the Maori Curriculum Statement for detail.
3. During the consultation process, the Parents/Whanau are asked to help identify barriers to learning and offer suggestions on how we can together lift achievements of their children.
4. The school keeps a written record of consultations. The record includes information on dates and key outcomes or decisions.
5. As a consequence of consultations, teachers will put in place agreed actions.
6. The school reports and reviews the achievement of its Maori students in relation to targets, as scheduled in its strategic plan.
7. Should parents/Whanau not respond to consultative opportunities, the staff develop targets and programs, share this with the students and parents. Feedback from the parents is sought.
