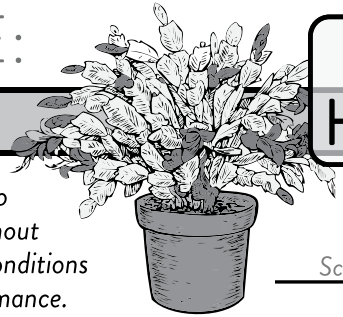


# CARE GUIDE:

## Holiday Cactus



*Holiday cactus is very easy to grow, and can live for years without much maintenance. Following are conditions for achieving optimal plant performance.*

**LIGHT** Bright, indirect light is ideal most of the year. From late winter to early spring, moderate light allows the plant to rest. Can be placed outdoors in a shady spot for the summer.

**WATER** From spring through fall, keep soil lightly moist. In winter, allow soil to nearly dry out before watering. If stems shrivel, the plant is not getting enough water.

**TEMPERATURE** Late spring to late summer, between 65°-80°F. In fall and winter, cool temperatures between 50°-65°F are preferred.

**FERTILIZER** From spring through summer, feed every 2 weeks with a balanced fertilizer mixed at about 3/4 of the recommended rate. In fall and winter, feed monthly.

**TIPS** Blooms best if a bit potbound, meaning the roots fill the pot. Repotting is needed when you see reduced flowering, and if you remove the plant from the pot and see roots filling the soil space completely. Summer is a good time to repot, if needed. Use the next size up pot from the current size, and use a potting mix for succulents or cactus.

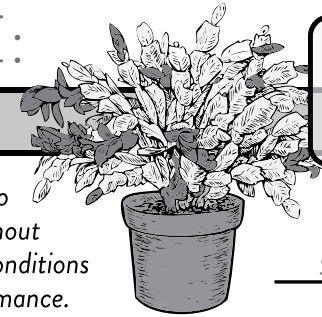
#### YOUR CACTUS FOR THE HOLIDAYS

*Flowering is related to day length and night temperatures. Try one of these methods to rebloom your plant.*

- Place in a location with night temperatures of 55°-60°F for 6 weeks, starting in early October, but no later than early November. Buds will develop, regardless of day length, if temperatures stay in this range.
- If night temperatures are above the required range, place in a dark room, or cover for 13 hours per day, starting in October.
