#### **Conference Coordinator - Linda Glantz**

Linda Glantz has been a member of Soroptimist International of Dixon since 1987, and during that 30 years has served in almost every position on the board, including twice as president. For many years, she was a club delegate and enjoyed attending every conference, having missed only 2 in 30 years! At the region level, she was District III Fellowship Director, and then District III Director on the Founder Region board. In the last four years she served as Founder Region's Fundraising Chair and is honored to be our Conference Coordinator under the leadership of Governor Pam.



#### Parliamentarian - Barbara Lanier

A retired attorney, Barbara Lanier was inducted into Soroptimist International of El Cerrito in 1995. In 1997, she agreed to serve as club vice president provided she never had to serve as president! That lasted until the fall of 1997 when the club president had to step down and Barbara took on the first of three years serving as club president. On the region level, she served first as District I Women's Opportunity Award Representative, then as District I Fellowship Director from 2002 to 2006 and as Founder Region District I Director from 2006 to 2008. Barbara was honored by Governor Amelia to be selected as Fellowship President 2008 to 2010. Loving her involvement with the incredible women who consistently make up the Founder Region Board, she prepared herself to become a Parliamentarian, joined the National Association of Parliamentarians and has been honored to serve as Parliamentarian for Governors Dona, Bobbi and Pam.



#### Fellowship President - Bobbi Enderlin

Bobbi Enderlin has been a member of Soroptimist International of Benicia since 1999. She served as Founder Region Governor from 2014-2016. Bobbi currently works as Accounting Manager for Pacific Rim Recycling, however in the past she worked for Pacific Bell in various capacities. She has also been a Meeting Facilitator, and an Instructor at UC Berkeley Extension, teaching communication skills to computer programmers. Bobbi lives in Benicia with her two black cats, loves to RV camp when she has time, and enjoys spending time with her family – her parents, two adult children and five grandchildren. Bobbi grew up in Calistoga in the Napa Valley where her parents still live.



#### Conference Keynote Speaker

#### Donna Garske - Executive Director, Center for Domestic Peace

Since 1974, Ms. Garske has worked at local, state, and international levels to advance safety, justice, and equality for women and children. Early in her career, Ms. Garske worked with the prison reform movement in California and Oregon, before becoming the Executive Director of Center for Domestic Peace (C4DP) in 1980. Throughout her tenure at C4DP, she has developed innovative responses to men's violence against women, including an internationally-replicated reeducation program for batterers, and one of the nation's first transitional housing programs for battered women, for which she earned an award from the American Planning Association. She has also worked with the Network of East-West Women to support domestic violence programs in Eastern/Central Europe and the former Soviet Union. Her advocacy efforts have influenced legislation in the US, such as the federal Violence Against Women Act and a California law that establishes minimum requirements for batterers' programs, which she co-wrote.

In 1992, Ms. Garske guided Center for Domestic Peace in creating "Transforming Communities: Creating Safety and Justice for Women and Girls" (TC) as a learning center for the advancement of new thinking, practices, and strategies to prevent violence against woman and girls; TC was recognized as a model approach by the National Academy of Sciences. In 1995, Ms. Garske was one of ten violence experts selected as a National Gimbel Foundation Child and Family Scholar as part of a program to explore new approaches to the prevention of VAW, with her article for the program "Transforming the Culture: Creating Safety, Equality and Justice for Women and Girls" published in Preventing Violence in America (Sage Publications,). In 1997, Ms. Garske expanded TC to become TC-TAT, a national technical assistance, training, and resource center dedicated to the prevention of VAW. Ms. Garske has led TC-TAT in developing multiple successful programs that address preventing VAW through youth and young adult education, awareness-building, community involvement and organizational development. She has guided TC-TAT in serving as a leader in facilitating dialogue, advancing learning, and disseminating best practices from model programs among VAW prevention advocates through the training of over 5000 individuals nationwide. In 1997, she was inducted into the Marin Women's Hall of Fame in recognition of her achievements in the area of social change.





#### Legislative Advocacy Panel

#### Marie O'Neill - Padma Life Coaching

Marie O'Neill is the founder of Padma Life Coaching located in Santa Rosa California. She holds a Bachelors of Science in Speech Language Pathology from the University of Utah and an MBA from Westminster College. Marie's life has not followed the usual twists and turns one would expect for an African American female born in poverty during the early 60's. Marie believes each of us is on a QUEST to come home to our indwelling self – to "know thyself" as the ancient Egyptian phrase placed above every temple of learning during the time read. Whether we realize it or not – each chapter of our lives – no matter its content, is a part of this quest and brings us closer to the goal. #### Elle Snow - Founder of Game Over

Elle is currently providing educational training to youth groups, community members, service providers, social workers, medical staff, foster parents, victim advocates, and law enforcement agencies throughout the nation. Elle is a Soroptimist Ruby Award winner and now a member of SI/Eureka. She has been recognized by Congress and Senate Members for her work in the anti-trafficking movement. She is a member of The Survivor-Leaders Institute and The National Survivor Network. Elle is cocreator of *Jane Doe in Wonderland*, a play written by Dell' Arte students: Kate Tobie, Erin Johnson, and Grace Booth. Elle is also currently a Speaker on The Rebecca Bender Initiative Speakers Team, as well as Founder/Board President of GAME OVER.



#### Lia Venet - WomenSpeak

Lia Venet is a Women's Empowerment Coach that loves to guide women back to their own wisdom and creating the life they desire. She holds space for women one on one as well as facilitates in a circle called WomanSpeak in Northern California. WomanSpeak is where women learn the art and soul of public speaking. Whether they want to improve communication in all of their relationships or speaking on big or small stages, it improves all areas of their life. Women gather two times per month to consistently practice speaking their truth in a safe community (no judgment, no comparison, no fixing what is wrong) where they are seen and celebrated for their brilliance and for being their authentic self.

#### **Soroptimist Dream Programs**

#### Live Your Dream: Education & Training Awards for Women

The Live Your Dream Award (formerly known as the Women's Opportunity Award) is the identifying program of Soroptimist International of the Americas. This award is given to a woman who is the head of household and is returning to school to improve the economic status of her family. Applications begin at the club level with local awards. Club award recipient applications are then forwarded onto the district level for judging. Those applications are then forwarded to the region chair for judging. The winning applicant from each district will be awarded \$1,000 from Founder Region at conference. The overall Founder Region winner receives an additional \$5,000 funded by Soroptimist International of the Americas. The remaining district winners are presented with \$3,000 each, also funded by Soroptimist International of the Americas. The Region winner's application is forwarded to Soroptimist International of the Americas for judging at the Federation level, thereby becoming eligible for one of three additional \$10,000 awards. On all levels, judges are to be non-Soroptimist.

#### **Violet Richardson Award**

The Violet Richardson Award recognizes young women who make the community and world a better place through volunteer efforts. The award is named for Violet Richardson Ward, the first president of the first Soroptimist club in 1921. Her motto was, "It's what you do that counts." The program begins at the club level, with club recipients becoming eligible for district awards. This year Founder Region is presenting a \$500 award to each district winner.

#### **Ruby Award: For Women Helping Women**

This award honors non-Soroptimist women who are making extraordinary differences in the lives of other women. The award begins at the local level where clubs recognize a woman in their community. Clubs submit their entry to the region level, where the region winner receives recognition at the region conference. A donation to Soroptimist International of the Americas is made in her honor.



#### Founder Region Annual Awards

#### Julia "Bess" Combs Membership Increase Award

This award is given to the club having the largest <u>net</u> growth in regular membership during the year from April 1st through March 31st. This net growth is <u>not</u> to include that of a newly chartered Soroptimist club sponsored by the club or region. Net growth is understood to mean increase above and beyond current regular membership minus those who resign or regular membership terminated for other reasons. This award is presented annually at conference. The winner is determined by the records of the Founder Region Treasurer. The original award was donated by Past Governor, Southwestern Region, Julia "Bess" Combs.

#### Barbara Stevenson "S" Club Award

This award is used for the sole purpose of honoring outstanding high school senior members of "S" clubs of Founder Region. Applications for this award are submitted by "S" club members with the selection of the winners to be made by the "S" club committee. The region board determines the dollar amount and number of awards given. All contributions to this fund received by the region treasurer shall be added to the principal. The chairman of the region "S" Club committee announces the winners at region conference. Awards will be given at the 2018 Conference.

#### Founder Region Fellowship—Fellowship/Grants In Aid




Founder Region Fellowship is a non-profit, incorporated entity within Founder Region Soroptimist International of the Americas. There are elected directors seated as the board, one from each district in the region. The Founder Region Governor-elect appoints the president in the second year of the biennium. Fellowships and grants in aid, (totaling not less than \$20,000) are awarded each year to graduate women in the last phase of their studies at a university offering a doctoral degree, within the boundaries of Founder Region. This program is a Founder Region Identifying Project and is administered through Founder Region Fellowship.

The first Soroptimist Club in the world was chartered the evening of October 3, 1921 in the West room of the Hotel Oakland. The name of the first club was the Soroptimist Club of Alameda County, with Violet Richardson serving as its charter president. In 1928, with the chartering of the Berkeley club, the Alameda County Club was renamed the Soroptimist Club of Oakland, also known as "the Mother Club".

#### **Conference Standing Rules**

#### 1. Registration

All members must be registered before being admitted to Conference meetings.

#### 2. Credentials

- (a) The Credentials Committee shall provide identification badges for voting delegates, Soroptimist members, and guests at the time of registration.
- (b) Identification badges shall be worn at all times and are not transferable.
- (c) Should a delegate be absent or unable to serve, the alternate shall assume the duties of the delegate AFTER qualifying at the registration and credentials desks. These duties shall be retained throughout the Conference.

#### 3. Seating

- (a) There shall be a designated seating area for delegates.
- (b) Attendees shall be seated five minutes before each session convenes.
- (c) The doors shall be closed when each session convenes; those awaiting admittance during session shall be admitted at the discretion of the pages.

#### 4. Communications

All communications for those seated at the platform and members of the assembly shall be delivered by an official page.

#### 5. Motions

Main motions and amendments shall be written on the official form provided, signed and sent to the chair by an official page.

#### 6. Debate

Debate shall be limited to two minutes for each speaker, five minutes per question and ten minutes for each article, except when permitted otherwise by the voting assembly by a two-thirds vote. No member may speak more than twice to the same question, except by consent of the voting assembly.

#### 7. Decorum

- (a) All meetings will be called to order on time.
- (b) The Chair at all times shall be addressed as Governor Bobbi.
- (c) A delegate or other member shall rise, address the Chair and having been recognized, shall state her/his name and the name of her/his club distinctly, making use of the microphone provided.
- (d) No delegate or officer shall leave the meeting room unless excused by the Chair.
- (e) The Chair shall recognize each member desiring the floor in proper order.
- (f) Both delegates and non-delegates shall be allowed the privilege of the floor. Precedence shall be accorded delegates.
- (g) Region committee chairs shall be accorded precedence of the floor at the discretion of the Chair, with the consent of the delegates, if they are speaking to an issue affecting their committee, or to an issue proposed by their committee and which was sent with the Call to Conference.
- (h) Members should be respectful of those around them and turn off any equipment that would distract from the meeting: cell phones on vibrate, computers on silent during conference sessions.

#### 8. Publicity

No discussion or action shall be released for publicity without the approval of the Region Governor.

#### 9. Recording Devices

Recording devices (i.e. tape recorders, video cameras) shall not be used during the Conference without the written consent of the Region Governor.
