**VOTING BODY:** The voting body of the Conference shall be the Region Board members and the

accredited delegates of each club in good standing. A club shall be deemed in good standing if all requirements of the Founder Region Bylaws and those established by the region conference, region board, and federation bylaws and procedures have been met at the time its delegates register. A delegate shall represent only the club

in which the delegate's membership is held.

**NON-DELEGATES:** All Soroptimists and guests are encouraged to attend.

#### Responsibilities of Club Delegates

The elected club delegates should have a working knowledge of Soroptimist International and Federation Bylaws, Region Bylaws, the objectives and ideals of the organization, and experience as a member of a club board or committee. An understanding of parliamentary procedure and a spirit of goodwill and understanding will help the delegate, the club, and the conference body.

The Club President, who serves as a delegate and the leader of the club delegation, should:

- 1. Allocate time at a business meeting to discuss Proposed Candidates and Bylaw Amendments (if any) and solicit club opinion or direction.
- 2. Arrange with the other delegates for assigning sections of the report on conference to be given to non-attending club members.
- 3. Participate in the Caucus Call on March 31, 2021 to learn about the Proposed Bylaw Amendments.
- 4. As soon as possible after conference, schedule time at a club meeting for delegates to present their reports.

#### Prior to Conference Delegates should:

- 1. Study the **Call to Conference** which indicates the tentative agenda listing business to be transacted, forms, presentations, social events & attendance incentives.
- 2. Verify with Club President or Treasurer that the **Club Delegate Registration Form** has been submitted for all delegates before the deadline to ensure online voting access.
- Participate in the Caucus Call to learn about the Proposed Bylaw Amendments.
- 4. Study the Proposed Bylaw Amendments and review Resumes of Candidates and discuss with your club
- 5. Refer to the Call to Caucus for timeline of voting through eBallot.
- Cast your vote online through eBallot between April 17 and April 30.

#### **During Conference Delegates should:**

- 1. Check with the Credentials Chair if you have not received your eBallot link to cast your vote.
- 2. Attend all sessions and take notes for precise reporting back to club.
- 3. Vote with the club viewpoint in mind.
- 4. Make sure you vote online before May 1.

#### After Conference Delegates should:

- 1. Prepare a report to present to your club that may include action taken during the business meeting and reason for each action.
- Discuss awards who won them and why? How can your club participate next year?
- 3. Present their personal evaluation of the conference and encourage increased club attendance at future meetings and conferences.

#### **PRESENTERS**

**Senator Hannah-Beth Jackson** is a former prosecutor and practicing attorney, educator, and small business owner. She was elected to the California State Senate in 2012 to represent the 19th Senate District, which includes all of Santa Barbara County and western Ventura County. A graduate of Scripps College in Claremont, California with a joint major in government and sociology, she received her law degree from Boston University Law School before returning to California to work as a deputy district attorney for Santa Barbara County. Eventually, she became the managing partner for the Law Offices of Eskin and Jackson, with offices in Ventura and Santa Barbara. She is also chair of the Select Committee on Women, Work and Families and chair of the Joint Legislative Committee on Emergency Management.



**Dr. Lois Merriweather Moore** is an author, researcher, and educator who has observed educational programs in Egypt, Mexico, Italy, Cuba and Spain. She is a retired Adjunct Professor in the International and Multicultural Education Department of the University of San Francisco where she presented research and published 2 books. Her commitment to educational excellence and community spans over 30 years. She has received the Martin Luther King Humanitarian Award, the Novato Citizen of the Year Award, the Bay Area Blacks in Philanthropy Leadership & Achievement Award, the Carl. A. Grant Multicultural Research Award and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation Gates Millennium Scholarship Award. She is an inductee of the Marin Women's Hall of Fame and currently serves as President of the Board of California's 4th District Agricultural Association.



**Surina Khan** is a first generation immigrant and came to the US with her parents and five older siblings in 1973, and has been dedicated to gender, racial, and economic justice issues ever since. As CEO of The Women's Foundation California, Surina oversees the Foundation's strategic direction which is focused on building community-based power through investing in effective community-based organizations, training community leaders in policy advocacy, connecting key partners, and mobilizing significant financial resources. Surina first became involved with WFC as a volunteer in 2004 serving on a grants review committee. She joined the staff in 2005 as a Senior Program Officer and was promoted to Director of Programs and then Vice President of Programs.



**Honorable Sandra A. Simms** is a member of SI/Waikiki Foundation, Inc. She graduated from Hyde Park High School before attending and graduating from the University of Illinois at Chicago with her B.A. degree in political science and sociology. Simms later obtained her J.D. degree from DePaul University College of Law in 1978. In 1991, Simms became the first African American female judge in Hawaii upon her appointment to the District Court of the First Circuit. Three years later, she was appointed Circuit Court Judge for the First Judicial Circuit by Governor John David Waihe'e, III. Simms retired as a circuit court judge in 2004

Dear Founder Region Soroptimists:

The 2020-2022 Founder Region Fellowship Board is having an amazing first year! Our District Meeting raffle was very successful despite the COVID-19 pandemic. Due to the generosity of our members, Fellowship named 16 new Fellows or Fellows who "leveled up." The Fellowship merchandise and Amazon gift cards raffle prizes were a big hit as well.

Currently, we are working on what we traditionally consider our primary fundraiser of the year. This year, due to mandated virtual meetings, our "Peacock Challenge" fundraiser is based on donations in which the raffle prizes are primarily Fellowship experiences. (See the flyer in the Conference materials for more details.) Those experiences include a Fellowship-hosted Zoom lunch or tea on Saturday, June 5 with a Fellowship award recipient. Another raffle prize experience is co-hosting a Fellowship awards recipient at both the upcoming Conference Fellows reception and Fellowship night as well as being a Silent Observer at two Fellowship semi-finalist interviews in March 2022. Of course, for every \$1,000 raised, we will draw for a Fellow or level-up. Remember: the larger your donation, the more raffle numbers you earn. As a bonus and based on the size of the donation, donors will receive one or more Fellowship merchandise items as "Thank You" gifts.

The "Peacock Challenge" raffle numbers went on sale in December; sales end on April 7, 2021. The Fellowship Board will draw raffle winners by mid-April. Those winning the co-hosting prizes will then be notified so they can prepare to co-host Fellowship awardees at Conference. The remaining raffle winners will be announced at Conference. Contact your Fellowship District Director to purchase raffle numbers.

Two additional fundraisers will be held this spring. One is a virtual Silent Auction for Deanna Hanks' pins coming in April. The other is a virtual fun walk/run scheduled for May; sign-ups are happening now. More details about both events are in this Call. Our fundraising supports the primary focus of Fellowship: to finance the Fellowship awards which recognize women in the final phase of their doctoral studies and whose work is likely to improve the lives of women and girls or benefit society in general.

In this time of social distancing and working remotely, Fellowship has utilized technology to deliver information about our Fellowship awards program to deans and student advisors at accredited universities and colleges with doctoral programs in Founder Region. As a result, we received 45 completed applications from students representing the University of Hawaii, U.C. Berkeley, Mills College in Oakland, Saint Mary's College in Moraga and California State University, East Bay in Hayward. The Fellowship Board has selected 23 applicants to interview in early-to-mid March. Following the interviews, the Board will select the women who will receive the 2021 Fellowship grants.

Fellows will not want to miss our virtual Fellows Reception at Conference on **Wednesday**, **April 28 from 6** – **7:30 p.m**. We plan to have Zoom breakout rooms to make informally meeting the 2021 award recipients more like meeting them in person. Everyone is invited to join us on **Friday**, **April 30 from 7** – **9 p.m**., for our virtual Friday evening program which will feature the 2021 award recipients talking about their work and future plans. Our Fellowship District Directors will close the evening by recognizing our 2020-2021 Fellows and those Fellows moving to the next level. If you want to be recognized at this conference for your new Fellow level or want a club member to be so recognized, final payments need to be received by Fellowship Treasurer Teresa or your Fellowship Director soon.

On behalf of the 2020-2022 Fellowship Board, many thanks for your ongoing support. In its 73<sup>rd</sup> year, the Founder Region Fellowship program would not exist without each of you.





### Virtual Conference Standing Rules

Due to the SIA mandate to "pause" all in-person activities throughout the Federation until further notice, the 2021 Founder Region Conference will be held virtually via Zoom Video Conferencing from April 28—May 2, 2021. Voting on the Founder Region & Fellowship Business, Proposed Amendments to the Bylaws, and election of the 2021-2023 Nominating Committee will be administered through eBallot.com.

#### **Standing Rules for the Virtual Conference:**

**1. Registration -** All delegates must be registered before being added to the voter list of the electronic ballot system provided by eBallot.com.

#### 2. Credentials

- a) The electronic ballot administrator shall provide User Name and Access Code for voting delegates.
- b) Credentials Report #1 coincides with the opening of electronic ballot #1 which includes voting on Amendments to the Proposed Bylaws Amendments.
- c) Credentials Report #2 coincides with the opening of electronic ballot #2 which includes voting on the elections, Bylaws Amendments as amended, and other conference business.
- **3. Communications -** Communications will be through email, the Founder Region website, Facebook page and conference calls.
- **4. Motions -** Main motions and amendments shall be written and sent to the chair electronically through email.
- 5. **Debate** If during a conference call there is a debate, then debate shall be limited to two minutes for each speaker, five minutes per question and ten minutes for each article, except when permitted otherwise by the voting assembly by a two-thirds vote. No member may speak more than twice to the same question, except by consent of the voting assembly on the conference call.

#### 6. Decorum

- a) All scheduled conference calls will be called to order on time.
- b) The Chair at all times shall be addressed as Governor Kris.
- c) A delegate or other member shall be allowed to speak when the opportunity is open or called by district and having been recognized, shall state her/his name and the name of her/his club distinctly.
- d) The Chair shall recognize each member desiring the floor in proper order by district.
- e) Both delegates and non-delegates shall be allowed the privilege of the floor. Precedence shall be accorded delegates.
- f) Region committee chairs shall be accorded precedence of the floor at the discretion of the Chair, with the consent of the delegates, if they are speaking to an issue affecting their committee, or to an issue proposed by their committee and which was sent with the Call to Conference.
- g) Members should be respectful of those around them and turn off any equipment that would distract from the meeting: cell phones on vibrate, computer notifications on silent during conference sessions.
- **7. Publicity** No discussion or action shall be released for publicity without the approval of the Region Governor.
- **8. Recording Devices** Conference Calls may be recorded when announced by the Chair. Recording devices (i.e. tape recorders, video cameras) shall not be used during the Conference without the written consent of the Region Governor.
