The Difference Between Fellowship and Laurel Society

Fellowship is exclusive to Founder Region. Laurel Society is an SIA program.

Fellowship was founded in 1948. **Fellowship** has provided grants to women in the final phase of their doctoral degrees. Some clubs donate \$1,000.00 and purchase a Fellow to honor one of their members, or a club Fellow.

During the first sixty-one years of the program over \$800,000 was awarded to more than 250 deserving women. During the past seven years, as the program has grown, over \$350,000 has been awarded to 35 deserving women.

Laurel Society- Since 1994, nearly 7,000 Laurel Society members have given over \$12 million help women through the Live Your Dream Awards and other Soroptimist programs. Clubs can donate \$1,000.00 and honor a club member with a **Laurel Society** membership.

Friendship Links

You can reach out to a club in SIA or any of the other Soroptimist Clubs around the world. This is a unique opportunity to partner with that club, to get new ideas, or just extend the loving arms of friendship.

If you would like to link with a club in the SIA federation, obtain the address from the club directory in the Member's Area of the SIA web site.

If you are having trouble contacting the club you wish to link with, please email SIA headquarters at **siahq@soroptimist.org**.

If the club accepts your link request, you may download a writeable friendship certificate from the program section of the Member's Area of the SIA web site. Download one for your friendship link, too.

Please let the program department (program@soroptimist.org) at SIA headquarters know about your new link so that it can be included in the Friendship Link directory.

Links Outside of SIA

If you know a specific club in another federation with which you would like to link, forward the application to the appropriate federation Friendship Link coordinator listed on the application.

Please let the program department (**program@soroptimist.org**) at SIA headquarters know about your new link so that it can be included in the Friendship Link directory.

- If you do not have a specific club with which you would like to link, send your application to SIA headquarters for inclusion in the Soroptimist Summary. Include the club correspondent's name and e-mail address.
- Remember that clubs reject links for a number of reasons, too many links is the one most often cited. Keep trying until you find an interested club.
- If you have not received a response from the club with which you would like to link after three months, consider contacting them again, or move on to another link.

Benicia Joint Project with Soroptimists in Ghana

SI Benicia reached out to SI Ghana after learning of a need the club has. The Ghana club is making hygiene kits to distribute to girls. As some of you may know, girls in some countries stay home when they are menstruating because they have no supplies. They miss school each month.

Rio Vista Project- Survival Bags


Soroptimist International of Rio Vista has a new project for the 2018/19 year. The club is collecting and assembling survival bags for women and girls in partnership with the Solano County Center for Family Justice.

The SFJC operates under the auspices of the Solano County District Attorney's Office and recently relocated to 604 Empire Street, Fairfield. According to the Center's

website, the District Attorney has indicated strong support for a violence prevention approach.

A partnership between the DA and the SFJC presents a unique opportunity to strengthen the DA's victim advocacy efforts. Some of the advocacy and preventative services include assistance for victims of domestic violence, human trafficking, child abuse, sexual assault and other social services including onsite support and counseling.

Many women and girls arrive at the center with only the clothes on their backs. The club is collecting new pajamas, under clothing, tooth brushes, shampoos, soaps and feminine hygiene products. The club hopes that the survival bags give these women and girls, if only for a few days or weeks, some dignity by providing the basic necessities for daily living.



Club and community members have been very generous, and the first ten bags were delivered to the center in mid-November.
