For this installation, I use miniature musical instruments, such as those used for Christmas decorations. You may use a larger instrument on the table if you wish. I give the miniature one to new officers as a remembrance.

, as First Vice President, we ask you to use a pitch pipe to be sure that no one is off key. We look to you to help us find the correct key to success as you serve as Dean of Departments and Programs and compile reports submitted by Club Presidents (use this if installing District Officers). We will look to you for guidance and we know you will see that our orchestra stays in tune.
, as President-Elect, your place in our symphony is the first violin Composers depend upon the violin to carry the weight of the message to the symphony. It is your duty to assist the President, to fill the vacancy of the President's office when necessary and to chair the District Ways and Means committee. Unless this is done, the music from your violin will become meaningless squeaks instead of tones sweet and clear

as acknowledgement of your acceptance of your responsibilities. We depend upon the conductor to carry the weight of the orchestra. We look to you for leadership as you select the music you will play for the next two years.

To the members; There are many other instruments, the flutes, the harps, the tubas, the cellos and of course the brass section. We ask each of you to choose an instrument so that all may have a part in the music. Co-operate with your conductor and try never to sound a sour note.
