God sees things we don't. He must, because He hasn't vaporized us yet. He must look at a
seriously messed-up world and still see what can be done with it. He sees what it can and
will be. (p.27)
1 Peter 2:12 "Conduct yourselves honorably among the Gentiles, so that in a case where they speak against you as those who do what is evil, they will, by your good works, glorify God on the day of visitation." Notice they speak against you now, but glorify God on the day of visitation. That means we win some of them by conducing yourselves honorably.
People are God's treasure. Psalms 119:162 "I rejoice over Your promise like one who finds vast" Matthew 6:19–21 "19 Don't collect for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal. 20 But collect for
treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys, and where thieves don't break in and steal. 21 For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." We store up treasure anytime we choose to do what God says, rather than what we feel at the moment.
