Presents vs Presence

June 2021 Newsletter

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Which do you want more: the presents of God, or the presence of God? In other words, is your focus more on what God gives you and how he can bless you? Or are you focused on God himself and enjoying his presence?

I have to admit that my prayers often reveal a focus on presents -- the things that God can give me. I ask for presents like good health for me or a loved one, a good day, safe travel, good weather, etc. None of these things are bad. But could this focus also reveal a heart that is self-centered? I'd never say it out loud and it's never in the front of my mind, but I think this thought swirls deep within me: "I want God because of what God can give to me or do for me." Yikes!

Even worse, I am sometimes tempted to gauge God's love for me by the same measure. Is God giving me lots of good things? Is my life relatively pain-free? Do I experience pleasure and enjoy plenty? Is God giving me what I want? Then God must be for me. God must be with me. God must love me. And when things aren't so good? I'm tempted to think the opposite.

Would you want to be my friend if I said to you, "Let's be friends because I want you to give me good gifts, and do nice stuff for me. And if you don't, I'll be mad at you and we won't be friends." I think you would recognize me as a narcissist and we wouldn't spend much time together. Yet don't we sometimes think that way about God?

God, have mercy on a me, a sinner!

A healthy relationship with God flows from a recognition and belief that HE is the prize, not the stuff he gives. His presence is infinitely better than his presents! The sons of Korah got it right when they wrote: *"As the deer pants for streams of water, so my soul pants for you, my God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When can I go and meet with God?"* Psalm 42:1-2.

But how can a sinner like me be in the presence of God? My sin makes me so ugly! It separates me from him. (Isaiah 59:2) There is one present of God that establishes the presence of God.

- *"The blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin" 1 John 1:7.*
- *"Therefore, brothers and sisters, since we have confidence to enter the Most Holy Place by the blood of Jesus... let us draw near to God with a sincere heart and with the full assurance that faith brings, having our hearts sprinkled to cleanse us from a guilty conscience and having our bodies washed with pure water" (Hebrews 10:19,22).*

The present of God to truly seek and celebrate is Jesus. He is the perfect substitute and sacrifice who cleanses you. That once-for-all present gives you his presence – now and forever! (Of course, with his presence come many presents. But they're not the goal of your faith, they're the result!)

A book could be written about this! And there was. Perhaps it's time to read (or reread) "Three Words that Will Change Your Life" by Mike Novotny.

Starting June 6

We will be starting a new sermon series this month on the weekend of June 6th entitled

"*What if Jesus Judged?*" The series will take a look at Revelation chapters 1-3. Here is a review of the series as well as the specific theme's for each of the eight weeks of the series.

Series summary: *What if Jesus Judged?*—What would Jesus say if he judged us? 2,000 years ago, the Son of God did that very thing, evaluating seven different 1st century churches. In this series, we read Jesus' analysis of seven 1st century churches and apply them to our spiritual lives as we seek to be faithful to our Savior. (6/6, 6/13, 6/20—Father's Day, 6/27, 7/4, 7/11, 7/18, 7/25)

Week #1: *The Jesus who Judges*—John describes the indescribable day when he saw the risen Jesus, glowing and glorious. This image reminds us that

Jesus is not meek and mild, but the mighty Son of Man who sits in glory at the right hand of God, ruling over all of creation for the good of his Church. In the midst of our own suffering, such a vision gives us comfort and allows us to endure until He returns. Text—Revelation 1:9-20

Week #2: *The Good, The Bad, & The Ugly* (Ephesus)—Jesus knows everything that happens. In every church. In every soul. He proves that by judging the church at Ephesus, praising what was good, pointing out what was bad, and demanding an end to all that was ugly and ungodly. In the same way, our Savior judges our lives out of his deep concern for our faith and our faithfulness to the Father. Text—Revelation 2:1-7

Week #3: *Faithful Unto Death* (Smyrna)—While Jesus never promises us an easy life, he does promise us two immensely important blessings: His knowing presence and eternal life. In our day, his promises have not changed, meaning that we can suffer well, trusting that our Father knows what we are going through (Father's Day connection!) and has the crown of life waiting for us at the end. Text—Revelation 2:8-11

Week #4: *Compromised Christianity* (Pergamum)—Despite severe pressure, the church at Pergamum did not deny the name of Jesus...but it did compromise its standards. Churches today face the same temptation, to believe that they are being faithful to Christ while subtly compromising their values. This message calls us to repent, hold to all of God's standards, and trust that Jesus is well worth it. Text—Revelation 2:12-17

Week #5: *The Company You Keep* (Thyatira)—Jesus judged the church at Thyatira for the company it kept, tolerating a spiritually toxic teacher in their congregation. Our Savior's words force us to open our eyes, look in the mirror, and look around to make sure that our teaching is pure in the sight of the One whose eyes are "like blazing fire." Text—Revelation 2:18-29

Week #6: *Woke for Jesus* (Sardis)—Despite its glossy brochures and impressive social media following, the church at Sardis was, in the eyes of Jesus, dead. "Wake up" the Savior commanded, "before it's too late!" For a church with a solid reputation, glossy brochures, and a trendy new website, we must turn our ears

toward Jesus and ask what God, and not man, thinks of our church. Text—Revelation 3:1-6

Week #7: Barely Holding On (Philadelphia)—Jesus knew the church at Philadelphia had little strength after suffering intense persecution. Yet, he praised them for holding on to the Truth they knew. In the same way, when we feel like we have no strength left, Jesus shows up to encourage us and promise us a bright, eternal future. Text—Revelation 3:7-13

Week #8: Knock, Knock (Laodicea)—Jesus knocked at the door of the church of Laodicea. Why? Because they needed to be rebuked so they would repent, despite their high self-esteem and strutting confidence. In our day, Jesus does the same thing, knocking on the doors of our churches and hearts, calling us to humbly repent and enjoy the glory of his presence. Text—Revelation 3:14-22



As most if not all of you know, the CDC updated a few of their COVID-19 guidelines recently, and since we continue to follow their recommendations, we wanted

to take this opportunity to communicate these changes to you as they pertain to our worship services.

1. Per the [CDC](#), “Fully vaccinated people can resume activities without wearing a mask or physically distancing, except where required by federal, state, local, tribal, or territorial laws, rules, and regulations, including local business and workplace guidance.”
2. In response to this new guideline, Outagamie County also lifted its mask mandate. The CDC still has mask recommendations in place for individuals in certain situations and environments.
3. Even as our nation is making progress in this pandemic, it is still important we continue to love our neighbor. Our current sermon series – “Where is the Love” is highlighting what love is and how we can show it to those around us. Two ways we can continue to love our neighbor is by:
 1. Staying home if we are feeling sick to protect the unvaccinated and those that are at higher risk.

2. Believing the best about each other and the decisions that are being made.
4. As a reminder, we will again be having outdoor worship services every Thursday evening this summer (weather permitting). These services will begin the first week of June.
5. We are so very thankful to see more people returning to church each and every week. As we move into the summer months, we hope that this continues to be the case and that your Gather root remains strong, whether in person or on-line.

Thank you for your ongoing prayers and support as we navigate these changes. We remain committed to our two goals of keeping people spiritually rooted and physically safe.





FAMILY DISCIPLESHIP

To me, summer always brings a nice change of pace. For me, summer brings more free time and over the years, I've fallen into a pattern of making that essential planning time for life and ministry. Part of my planning involves revisiting and improving upon my Grow Root – being in the Word of God at home personally, with my spouse, and with my children. I share that with you because my guess is that summer may bring a similar change of schedule for you and your family. I'd encourage you, if so, to take advantage of the time and grow more in the Word of God at home. To help you out, especially any teens or pre-teens in your home who we'd love to see form some helpful faith habits, here's a devotion from our WELS church body. Transformed – teen devotion – From May 16, 2021

The May series is for the times we may hit rock bottom as we experience seasons of fear and weariness, despair and depression, pain and loss ... all of them due to sin. Yet God never leaves or abandons us. He pursues and seeks us in our dark moments.

“The eyes of the Lord are on the righteous, and his ears are attentive to their cry; but the face of the Lord is against those who do evil, to blot out their name from the earth. The righteous cry out, and the Lord hears them; he delivers them from all their troubles. The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit.” (Psalm 34:15-18)

Rock bottom ... Why now? A lament.

One dictionary definition for the word “lament” is “to express sorrow, regret, or unhappiness about something.” While you maybe haven't used the word before, all of us understand it's meaning, as we do just that from time to time when things go wrong. Sometimes moms and dads are the recipients of our laments. Sometimes it's a coach or a teacher. Sometimes its friends. Whenever we hit rock bottom, we all look for someone “to express sorrow, regret, or unhappiness about something.”

Too often, though, going to the Lord seems to be our last resort. When bad things happen, we so often try to figure out the best course of action on our own, or we turn to a friend who means well but is ill equipped to give us any wise advice because they might be dealing with some of the same things. Too often, the Lord is the last one we turn to in our time of need, sharing our concerns and sincerely crying out, “I need help!”

That's why Psalm 34 is such a great reminder for all of us, no matter what we might be dealing with or wondering what's next in life. A young David, the author of Psalm 34, was at a difficult time of life. He was all alone and running for his life from King Saul, who wanted him dead. David knew where to turn, *“The eyes of the Lord are on the righteous, and his ears are attentive to their cry”* (v. 14). David knew as he was nearing rock bottom, *“The righteous cry out, and the Lord hears them; he delivers them from all their troubles. The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit”* (v. 17-18). David's Old Testament proclamation is the truth we still live by today. Jesus loves you. He died for you. He will never leave you. You can go to him in prayer knowing he hears and is willing and able to help. What comfort that gives—today and always, no matter what we might be dealing with.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, there is so much pain and suffering in the world around me. My own life is filled with challenges and issues that cause me at times to feel like I am all alone. Be with me today and always, dear Lord. I come to you in prayer needing your guidance and power, your caring and your love. In Jesus' name, I pray this to you in my time of need. Amen.

BE THERE AN ESSAY

There are many things to do that can help, but I discovered three important things to do to help people and their families. Here are the three B's that can be used to help veterans, their families, and nearly anyone who needs your support. These can make a big difference.

1. **BECOME:** Sometimes it may feel difficult to figure out what to do. The best thing to do in that situation is to become them. Put yourself in their shoes. What would you want for comfort in a difficult time? Use sympathy to understand what exactly to do during these times. It can make a big difference.
2. **BIND:** This family needs support. You should get to know this family and bind your relationship with them. That way, whenever they need your moral support, they can trust you.
3. **BE THERE:** It is important to always be around that person, sending cards, baking goods, or doing whatever you can at times where they might need your support. If you don't, they're friendship may be unbound and they could lose your support. The **MOST** important thing to do to help someone in need of your support is to just be there for them.

There are many different ways to support your neighbor, but I think they can all fall down into three categories. Make sure to become your neighbor, to put yourself in their shoes. Bind your relationship with your neighbor, to make sure you don't lose it. And the most important thing to remember, be there. Just the little things can make a big difference to someone, especially if it is a mental pain! Now, after you read this essay, or I read it to you, remember that when you leave today, I hope you feel changed. I hope something in this essay made your mind click. I hope you go out into this conflicting and confusing world, and change as many people's lives as you can, to try to make this world a better place.

Director of Operations Report – June, 2021

- 1) We are still preparing for and very much looking forward to this year's 922 Ministries **"Swing for Success" Golf Outing** that will be held **on Saturday, June 5 at Irish Waters Golf Course in Freedom**. This will be our tenth annual event and we have raised more than \$140,000 in the past nine events. We are proud that we can give 100% of our proceeds to our designated areas of ministry, and this year it will be tuition assistance for St. Peter Lutheran School and the Good Samaritan fund. Please consider supporting this great event in any way possible, with prayers, with your time to volunteer, with monetary donations or through many of our sponsorship opportunities.
As of this writing we have 132 golfers, which is full capacity for the golf course, so we can't accept any more golfers for this year's outing.
- 2) By the time that many of you read this, it will be past June 5 and the golf outing will be over for another year. I want say a huge thank you to the many great people who attended to support us again this year, and for the wonderful God loving friends Gary and Sue Thoma who put so much effort into this cause with us and make a lot of work seem like a lot of fun.

- 4) The tree donated by Paul and Jill Zuberbier in memory of Paul's brother Mark has been planted just to the east of the entrance to the 1982 portion of the school building. Thanks Paul & Jill!
- 5) We've decided not to do anything with the asphalt area behind the parsonage for this year.
- 6) Thursday night services will be held outdoors beginning Thursday June 3 and continuing through the summer until weather forces us back inside. Every Thursday night at 6:30 PM the services will be held outside in the courtyard area by the main administrative office entrance – Door #1.
- 7) Joel Weeks will be assisting some young people under the supervision of Builders for Christ who will be making some improvements to the mezzanine area above where the locker rooms are located on the west end of the gym. The area was never finished off and is uneven. Our insurance carrier, Church Mutual, has recommended improvements, and secure railings in that area to conform to safety codes.
- 8) Joel Weeks will be doing some work in our cemetery again this summer – raising and lifting stones, level areas with dirt, planting grass and just doing some things to improve the appearance.
